ST. DUNSTAN'S COLLEGE.

Summary Report of Father Burke's Remarks on Education.

The orator at the closing exercises of St. Dunstan's College in St. Patrick's Hall on Monday evening last was Rev. A. E. Burke, of Albion. His address was a vigorous presentation of the educational question from the standpoint of the Roman Catholic Church.

The address started out with a pretty compliment to the Rector of St. Dunstan's College, Fr. Curran, whose pupil the orator said he had been "in his green and salad days upon the benches of the George-own grammar school." It then struck deep into the philosophical, theological, social and moral aspects of education. The child was committed to the parents by Almighty God and to the spiritual institution, which is called the Church, to be educated. The State has rights. It should see that its subjects were sufficiently well instructed in those matters necessary to the fulfillment of their obligations towards it. It should therefore patronize, and not monopolize, education. State education, in the latter sense, invaded the personal right of the child, the domestic right of parents, the Divine right. Not contented to expose its defects on principle, the results of secular education were portrayed in graphic style and statistics and the utterances of great men quoted against it. The claims of the religious school where all the faculties of the soul—the intellect and the will—are educated proportionately were strongly put, and such education declared the only one acceptable to the Catholic conscience or in consonance with right reason.

In graceful transition Father Burke came to speak of our Provincial school system, which, whilst not responding to Catholic requirements, was that which, in many sections, the Catholic people had to make use of. They should watch over its operations with redoubled vigilance. "Vigilance is the price of faith to you," cried the speaker passionately. They should see that the best men from the point of view of moral character and intellectual attainments, were selected to preside over the schools. They should study their efficiency. Religious instruction should be implemented by extra effort in the family, the Sunday school and the church. Ultimate, our community, "instinct with justice" will come to the Catholic view of education in its own interests. Father Burke declared there were difficulties in the way, but there was nothing impossible to an intelligent, progressive, God-fearing people. He trusted the majority would be just and recognize the rights of the minority. It was no credit to the community that Catholics were obliged to pay to schools which they could not in conscience tally approve. It was certainly not creditable that they should be made to pay to build and support a college for the education of non-Catholics for the liberal professions while they got not a cent to aid their own college, to which alone in conscience Catholic young men, seeking higher education, could go. It was no honor to the city of Charlotte that its poor Catholic citizens were obliged to support out of their spare earnings two large schools whose teachers were willing to qualify according to the standard of the state and submit to the state's inspection because presided over by religious devoted to education along the only proper lines. The action of the School Board and some of its members then came in for a few words of vigorous condemnation. Then Father Burke declared in earnest terms that Catholics had no quarrel with Protestantism. The duty of the hour was for all Christians to combine against the spread of irreligion and infidelity, which, menacing the state and church equally, stalked boldly through the land.

Society never demanded good men more urgently than it did to-day. The religious education going hand and hand with the secular could alone produce them. He gave, then, an exceedingly eloquent and impassioned description of the ideally educated Catholic which he terminated with the words of Thomas More, Montaigne and Whomson. After denouncing in caustic terms "the mere political acrobats who climb into high places on a Catholic and Catholic influence, and, landed there, compromise at one fell swoop every principle Catholics hold dear, using the very places secured to them to bring confusion on their Church and shame upon her ministers."

To professors of St. Dunstan's were then commended in fitting terms, the orator speaking from an intimate acquaintance with the men and their methods, and the most formal and eloquent address the city College has listened to for some time concluded with the words of the Prophet Isaiah, "But they that are learned shall shine as the brightness of the firmament, and they that instruct many to justice as stars for all eternity."
