Farm Prices & Market Report

Following are excerpts from the farm marketing report of the Provincial Department of Agriculture, prepared by Mr. W. R. Shaw, Deputy Minister:

There have been a number of changes in the livestock market since last week. Hog prices are up \$1.50, and sows are up \$2.00 at both Moncton and Charlottetown. Cattle quotations, however, have been revised downward at both centers, as have lamb quotations at Moncton.

The following are the details:
Hogs at Moncton: Grade A 28.00; Grade B1 27.50; No. 1 sows 20.00; No. 2 19.00; hot dressed weight delivered.

Hogs at Charlottetown: F. O. B. country points: Grade A 27.00; Grade B1 26.50; No. 1 sows 19.00; No. 2 sows 18.00.

Cattle at Moncton: Delivered to plant. Steers: Choice 20.50; Good 19.50; Medium 17.00; Common 11.00 to 12.00. Heifers: Choice 20.00; Good 19.00; Medium 16.00; Common 11.00 to 12.00. The price of eggs has advanced by 2c on A Large and A Medium, and Charlottetown dealers are now quoting for ungraded eggs delivered: AL 35, AM 31, AS 23, B 22, C 15; and are quoting for the graded pack delivered: AL 43-44, AM 39-40, AS 30, B 30, C 22; and are quoting retailers loose: AL 45 1-2, AM 41 1-2, B 34. Retail to consumer price remains unchanged at AL 47-53, AM 47-49, B 42-43.

Rural stations are quoting for ungraded eggs delivered: O'Leary: AL 35, AM 31, AS 25, B 25, C 16. Bedeque: AL 36, AM 31, B 27, C 18.

St. Peter's: AL 35, AM 31, AS 23, B 23, C 15. Vernon Bridge: AL 35, AM 30, B 23, C 18.

Keen Demand—Halifax
This egg market remains on a firm basis and paying prices on A grades have been advanced. Under a brisk demand, current arrivals are clearing well.

Sydney Market, February 9th, 1953. Dealers are paying for the graded pack loose: AL 50, AM 48, AS 46, B 46, C 26. Dealers selling loose: AL 54, AM 52, AS 50, B 50, C 30. Retail prices in cartons: AL 55-59, AM 53-59.

Eggs prices on this market have strengthened. The demand is it will be noted that there is not only some variation in the prices within the Province on eggs, but still there is still a large gap between the prices producers on Prince Edward Island and at Halifax and Sydney.

Dairying
According to official quotations from Nova Scotia the price of butter on the Halifax market increased two cents during the past week, and is quoted now at 66¢ wholesale, delivered, with local jobbing at 68¢.

On the New Brunswick market the price remained the same as that of last week with no change being contemplated. The wholesale price is 64¢ delivered, with local jobbing at 66¢.

Charlottetown prices remained steady with local jobbing at 65¢, the wholesale price being that of Nova Scotia or New Brunswick, less freight.

The halt in sale of butter from the Dairy Products Board caused serious shortages in some areas. Artificial prices were created in communities of very short supply. This may account for the two cent increase in the Province of Nova Scotia, with no corresponding increase either in New Brunswick, Montreal, or Toronto.

Feeds
Feed prices are approximately the same as those of last week's quotations. There has been a slight easing off in the price of barley and oats, but the trend remains reasonably strong. No. 1 feed barley, bulk, is quoted at \$2.82, and oats at \$2.62 1-2. There is not yet much movement in local grains, particularly for seed purposes. Millfeeds and bran are at last week's levels, with a price of \$2.95 for bran and shorts and \$3.10 for middlings. There is no change in the protein market. One of the aggravating factors in the feed grain trade is the unpredictability of both supply and price. There will be no improvement in the situation until the farm op-

ganizations across Canada devise some plan which will take care of uniform delivery and provide for uniform prices.

Potatoes
The potato situation is somewhat discouraging, although there are some evidences of a strengthening trend. There does not seem to be any very fixed opinion as to just what potato prices should be either in Canada or in the United States, but with supplies as they are, particularly in Canada, we should have at least reached the bottom of the price level.

During the week the New Brunswick Marketing Board met and did what it was predicted it would not do, namely, set a minimum price on New Brunswick potatoes at a level of \$2.75 per barrel of 105 pounds, or \$3.00 f.o.b. shipping point, which amounts from \$1.00 to almost \$1.10 per bushel.

The Prince Edward Island Board in conformity with this price also met and shaded its minimum price down to conform closely to the New Brunswick level. The new prices are \$1.35 per 75 lbs. bulk at the farm in the inner zone, and \$1.30 per 75 lb. sack in the outer zone. This amounts to about \$1.08 per bushel at the farm. Preliminary Cost Of Coronation

LONDON, (Reuters) — British taxpayers have received an inkling of how much of their money will be spent on staging one of the world's most costly and glittering pageants—the Coronation June 2.

A report presented in Parliament Wednesday showed that by the end of March the government will have paid out £367,000 on Coronation preparations.

This is only an estimate on preliminary work completed in the year ending March 31. Remainder of the expenses incurred between then and June 2 will be marked down on the country's bill for the next fiscal year.

The Wednesday report showed quantity of potatoes exported during the year, which I would estimate at about 5 millions of bushels up to the present time. This is a huge pile of potatoes, and the prices generally speaking have been maintained at a high level. I think it is generally recognized that the efforts of those who are primarily concerned with the sustaining of the market price are worthy of a great deal of commendation.

that most of the preliminary cost, £350,000, has gone toward sprucing up 1,000-year-old Westminster Abbey, where the Queen will be crowned, and on the erection of seats for thousands who will witness the spectacle.

The rest was used as office expenses by the earl marshal, the Duke of Norfolk. He is directing the production of the numerous Coronation celebrations.

The report took no account of the millions of pounds which will be spent on civic and private Coronation celebrations. Hundreds of laborers are enlarging Westminster Abbey's seating capacity to 7,500 from 2,500. New carpets and tapestries are being installed. Facilities are being constructed for television cameras. At least 100,000 persons will watch the Queen drive in state through the city before and after the ceremony from government-built seats along the 1 1/3-mile professional route.

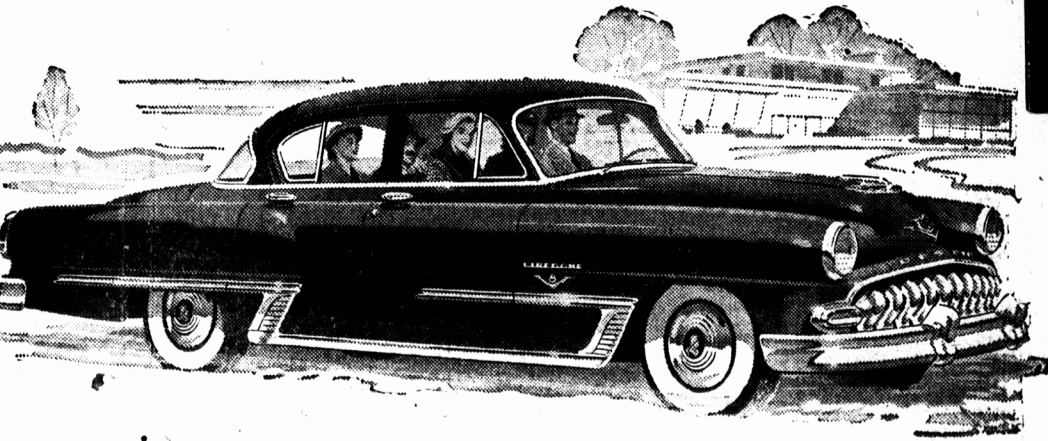
The government hopes to raise close to £135,000 from sale of these seats, which will sell at £6 and £4.
