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# Ontario And B.C. Sections Put In Designated Areas

OTTAWA (CP)—All of the Georgian Bay perimeter in Ontario and Salmon Arm, B.C., have been added to the list of designated areas to which government incentives for new industry will apply.

Industry Minister Drury said here these areas were added as the result of discussions with Ontario and B.C. during and following last month's federal-provincial conference.

Announcing the new list of designated areas formally—they had become public during the federal-provincial meeting—Mr. Drury said they cover about 10 per cent of the labor force.

The original list of areas enjoying special tax holiday and accelerated depreciation benefits to encourage new industry covered about 7½ per cent of the labor force. This list had been prepared in the autumn of 1963.

The northeastern half of Halifax County now will be designated, the St. George de Beauce area of Quebec will come closer to Levis, and the Okanagan area will embrace all of that economic region.

"The government's plan is to bring new opportunities of employment to the people in areas which have suffered over the years from an inability to share in the general growth of the country," Mr. Drury said.

The industry minister said the government intends to review the designated areas list annually, starting in the autumn of 1966.

In addition to tax holidays and accelerated depreciation allowances for expanded industry

in the designated areas, the federal government now offers outright grants towards the capital of new processing facilities.

These grants can run as high as \$5,000,000 and are to be made on a sliding scale—one-third of the first \$250,000 of capital costs, one-quarter of the next \$750,000 and one-fifth of capital costs over \$1,000,000.

Mr. Drury told a press conference it is not possible now to estimate accurately what the whole program might cost, but \$50,000,000 is being earmarked for it initially. The money will have to be voted by Parliament.

## PRIME MINISTER PEARSON ANNOUNCED

June 7 in the Commons that the criteria for designating areas of slow-growth for special federal incentives would be extended. Originally, chronic unemployment was the sole criteria. Now low average family incomes and areas of declining employment are included.

## TAKES IN NEWFOUNDLAND

In the new list the areas designated are:

- All of Newfoundland except the barren area in Labrador north of latitude 55.
- All of the Maritime provinces with the exception of Dartmouth, N.S., Fredericton and Saint John, N.B., and their immediately adjacent areas.
- All of eastern and northern Quebec except Quebec City and Levis.
- The area generally surrounding Georgian Bay.
- Northwestern and southeastern Manitoba and the northern tier of Saskatchewan as far north as the 55th parallel of latitude.
- Northwestern Alberta to the 55th parallel.
- The Okanagan Valley of British Columbia, including Salmon Arm.
