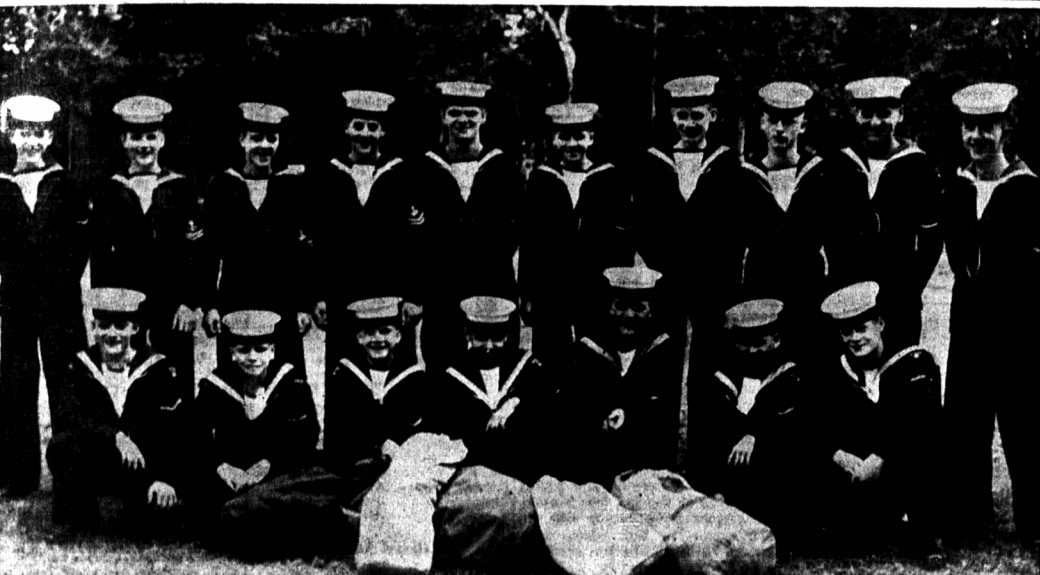

In Memoriam

MRS. P. A. MACISAAC

On June 16, 1955, a deep shadow of sorrow and gloom hung over the residents of Souris Line Road enveloping the community with its depressing folds and filling the hearts of all with grief, when it was learned that Mary Josephine, wife of Peter A. MacIsaac was taken suddenly ill.

Medical aid was quickly summoned, but six hours later the grim reaper stretched forth its icy hand and death clasped in its chilly embrace all that was mortal of a good and respected neighbour at the age of 69 years.

Left to mourn the loss of a devoted wife and mother are her husband, two sons, Hugh and Waldron at home; two daughters, Helen F. on the teaching staff of Souris High School and Mary A. of Jamaica Plain, Mass., who arrived home for the funeral. Besides the immediate family there are also two brothers, Adrian and Michael MacInnis, Souris, and two sisters, Regina (Mrs. Thomas Gracie) and Agnes (Mrs. Edward Kelly), Roxbury, Mass.

The funeral, which was largely attended, was held Sunday afternoon, June 19, from her late residence to St. Mary's Church, Souris, where the funeral services were conducted by the Pastor, Rev. J. A. Murphy, assisted by Rev. George MacDonald, St. Margaret's and Rev. W. A. Keefe, Rollo Bay. Rev. Edwin Steele assisted the choir.

Interment took place in the adjoining cemetery where the committal prayers were recited by her beloved pastor, and the mortal remains of a loving wife, an exemplary mother, a gracious lady blessed by a host of friends, a daily servant of her God and a devoted member of the church she served and loved were laid to rest. May she rest in peace.
