CNR May Reconstruct Shipping Facilities Here

It was learned yesterday unofficially that a possible reconstruction and renovation may be in the offing for Canadian National Railways property in Charlottetown.

The project will be in connection with express and less-than-carload-lot freight, and will probably result in the raising of the present structure of Water Street, which for more than a year has been used for the handling of express and freight. The express space was relocated in the building in 1962.

It was not possible to obtain confirmation that the railway passenger depot will be renovated and modernized.

Asked yesterday for comment, Douglas LaCombe, CNR public relations officer for the Atlantic region, said the whole picture is being studied in the light of changing conditions affecting the handling of express and freight. He said a decision may not be reached for several weeks. Money has to be made available for such a reconstruction, Mr. LaCombe added.

CHANGING FACTS

The changing face of CNR operations in this province is evident from decisions announced several days ago which discontinued the regular winter service on Eastern lines, and in the attempt by the railway to curtail the regular, daily train service between Charlottetown and Tignish.

This involves passenger, express and freight service, and the stout resistance being marshalled by active Prince County organizations will culminate in a hearing before the Board of Transport Commissioners of Canada in Alberton, on Nov. 13.

The regular winter service discontinued on the eastern line involves passenger service of the Georgetown, Murray Hill and Elmira and Souris lines. The CNR has operated this service during the winter months since 1956 since the year-round service was discontinued in the mid-1950s.
