**New Zealander Captures Race**

**DOUGLAS, Isle of Man (CP-AP)**—Hugh Anderson, 27-year-old New Zealander, won the 100-mile international trophy motorcycle race here Wednesday aboard a Japanese Suzuki machine.

He covered three laps of the tough Isle of Man mountain circuit—a total of 113.2 miles—in sparkling form in one hour, 16 minutes and five seconds. His average speed was 89.27 miles an hour.

Second was Frank Perris of Britain, also a Suzuki. Another Suzuki machine, ridden by West German Ernst Degner, was a third.

The Canadian entries—including Mike Duff and Don Hadow of Toronto and Geoff Kelland of Vancouver — did not place among the first 12 finishers.

**FLOODS EBB**

**HAVANA, Cuba (Reuters)** — Floods caused by heavy rain in eastern Oriente province began receding Wednesday, leaving at least 11 persons dead and damage estimated at \$1,000,000. Thousands of acres of crops were reported destroyed and small towns near the river Cauto, largest in the area, were isolated. Army helicopters were flying in emergency supplies.
