Sport Echoes From Prince County

Let's face it. The Mayor's Rink Fund, which started out as a fine, energetic new-born with everybody clucking it under the chin and exclaiming: "What a cute baby!" has failed to grow into the sturdy youngster it was expected to do. With its present feeding schedule it looks as if it's going to be a very anemic teen-ager with little hope of its growing into a robust adult.

The cause has been laid to the lack of interest and effort on the part of the Summerside citizens. But we're not at all sure that this is the main cause for lack of success. The first \$50,000 was to be raised by organizations making money by means of various projects, and by donations from small business establishments. Let us suppose there are 100 of these units, although you'll have plenty of trouble counting up to a century if you start checking them off. But if granting there are 100, it would mean organizations would have to raise an average of \$500, and small businesses would have to donate, on the average, the same sum to realize \$50,000.

Even with plenty of effort and enthusiasm on the part of organization, and generosity of small business men, we doubt if much more than \$20,000 could be raised in a year by such a plan, and as this first \$50,000 was only a quarter of the \$200,000 deemed necessary to build the rink, it looks more and more as if this scheme might turn out to be a very long-term plan.

We must commend Mayor Wedge for his efforts. He is the only one so far who has come up with any type of plan, or, at least, acted on any type of plan. And moving towards the goal of our desire, even at a snail's pace, is better than standing still. We, as well as many others, thought when the plan was first presented that it might be successful. But we are now convinced that the original plan without modifications of some kind is scarcely feasible.

Success, however, has often been achieved by a system of trial and error. Why not acknowledge our miscalculations, institute some improvements, and go on from there? We're on the right road, and facing in the right direction, but the gas-buggy we're in is not making the mileage we had hoped for. Let's face it.
