Candles On Coffin Cause \$10,000 Fire

SHEPPEGAN, May 12, (CP)—Candles on both sides of a coffin containing the body of Mederic Boudreau, 48, were reported to have caused a \$10,000 fire which destroyed the home and barn of Ernest Boudreau at Six Roads, five miles from Sheppegan.

The fire started while the family was at supper late today. Ernest Boudreau smelled smoke, opened a door of the room where the body lay and found the place ablaze.

Lack of water left the Sheppegan Fire Department helpless. Fire warden A. L. Loster of St. Isidore's was called when the flames spread to woods but little further damage occurred.

The funeral of Mederic Boudreau whose body was destroyed, will have been held tomorrow from the Roman Catholic Church at Pokemouche.

Eight persons were left homeless.

In Memoriam

ROLAND ALCHORN

Residents of Rocky Point and vicinity together with many relatives and friends were deeply grieved, and their hearts saddened when they received the news of the death in the P. E. Island Hospital on March 20, of Roland Alchorn, a resident of Rocky Point at the comparatively early age of forty-seven. Just why he should be taken from his loved ones in the prime of manhood is all a part of the Divine plan of which we have no understanding, but of which the dear ones left behind can say with faith and love "God's will, not ours, be done."

The late Mr. Alchorn was the son of Mr. and Mrs. James Alchorn, both deceased, of Fairview, and spent all his life in the immediate vicinity of his birthplace. His was a life which could be truly said to be exemplary of industry, integrity and charity, both in word and deed. Although having borne from boyhood a physical handicap, nevertheless he labored always cheerfully and successfully in order to supply the needs of life first to his parents, and later to his wife and family.

On several occasions he served the public in various ways. In this capacity, his gracious manner and his courtesy to all were outstanding and were commented on by many with whom he associated.

Up until about five years ago, "Rolie," as he was known, to his friends attended to his daily work. At that time he was stricken with an illness which made him practically an invalid, and finally caused his death.

During those years he was never heard to lament or complain. Not a few who visited him since he was laid aside from duty, commented on his cheerfulness and his lively and kindly interest in community affairs.

Before his removal to the hospital Mr. Alchorn was tenderly cared for by his wife and family, who did everything possible to prolong his life and ease his sufferings. Up to the very end his thoughts and words were of their welfare and comfort.

Besides his widow, the former Margaret White of Rocky Point, there are left to mourn the loss of a loving husband and father, one son Linus, and one daughter Audrey, both at home.
