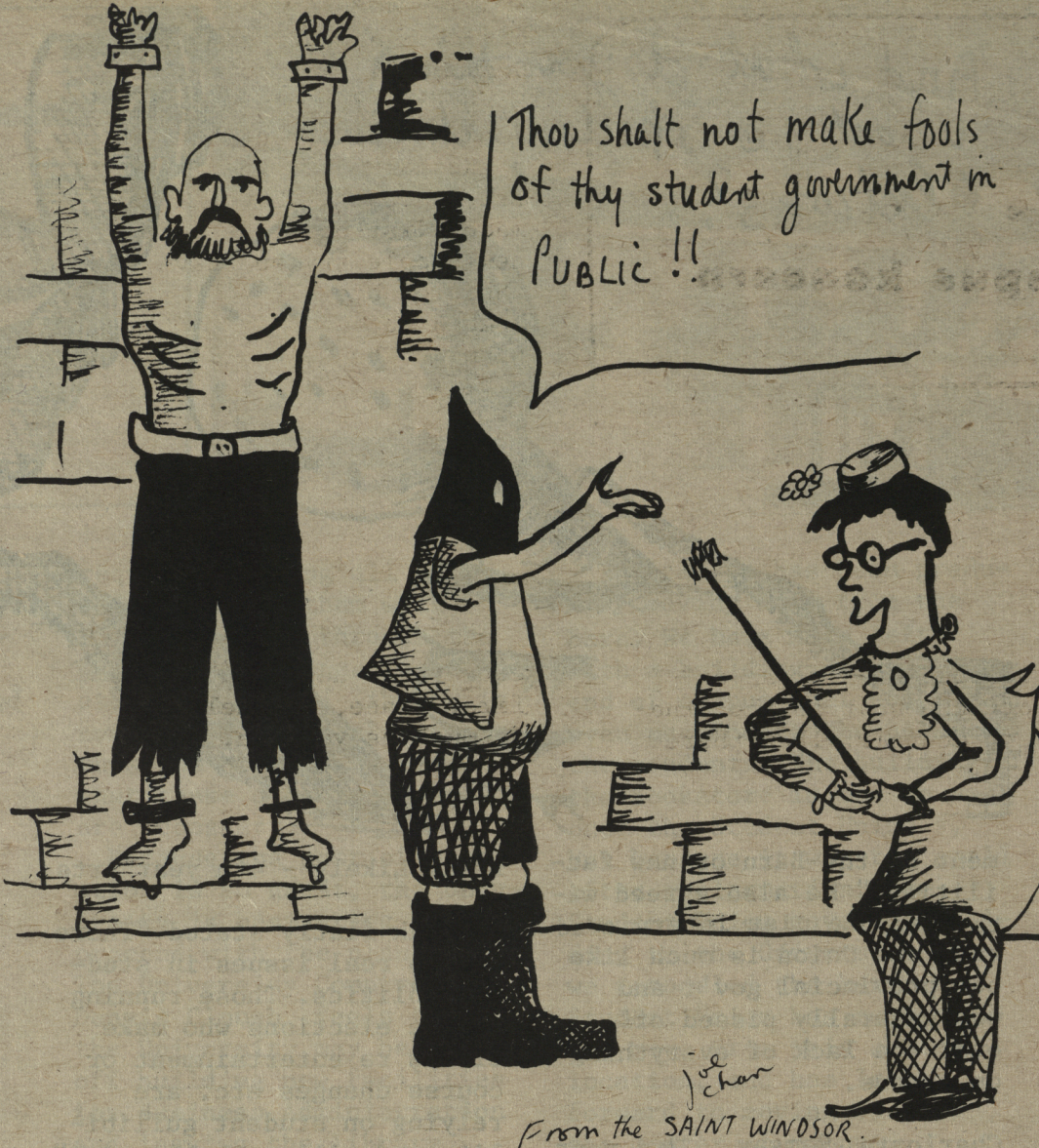
but never-the-less we really do hate to see you dissappointed.
