## Bruins Shutout N.Y. Rangers 3-0

**NEW YORK (CP)** — Boston Bruins moved into a fourth-place tie with Toronto Maple Leafs Sunday night when they shut out New York Rangers 3-0 in a National Hockey League game here.

Goalie Terry Sawchuk of the Bruins turned back only 17 shots to earn his seventh shutout of the season. The crowd of 14,290 saw the Rangers give one of their poorest performances of the season on Madison Square Garden ice where they had lost only four of 27 previous games.

It took Boston only a little more than a minute to set the pattern of the dull contest. Leo Labine took a pass from Bill Quackenbush and found the nets with a slap shot at 1:12.

Johnny Peirson got the other two Bruin tallies. The first came at 17:54 of the second period and actually was batted into the cage by New York defenceman Bill Gadsby.

An intended pass by Peirson glanced off Gadsby's stick.

Peirson's final goal at 4:59 of the third period was a legitimate one coming on a shot from the right 20 feet out.

The victory enhanced the Bruins' chances of landing a Stanley Cup playoff position. Boston and Toronto each have 48 points. The Leafs have played one more game.

The crowd of 14,290 got most of their fun from a pigeon which flew around the Garden and landed on the ice several times.

The Yankees hope Maury McDermott will be the answer to their search for another starting pitcher. Another top-flight reliever and a shortstop with punch is another must for the American League champions. Cleveland needs a first baseman, and must worry about the advancing age of its big three pitchers.

Milwaukee needs a hard-hitting left-handed outfielder, a southpaw pitcher, a second baseman and a relief pitcher. The Braves also must find out whether first baseman Joe Adcock will be as good as he was before his hand fracture of last August.
