**Bogus Cheques Case Adjourned**

OTTAWA (CP)—A Montreal man, charged with uttering bogus travellers' cheques, was remanded one week without plea when he appeared in magistrate's court here.

Police said Jack Kane was arrested last Tuesday after a man tried to cash \$100 travellers' cheques, made out to Bob Toa, at a branch of the Bank of Nova Scotia.

Bank employees, warned of a nationwide ring dealing in counterfeit travellers' cheques, detained the man until police arrived.

Toronto police said Wednesday 100 highly organized forgers, operating in 50 teams, have fanned out across the country.

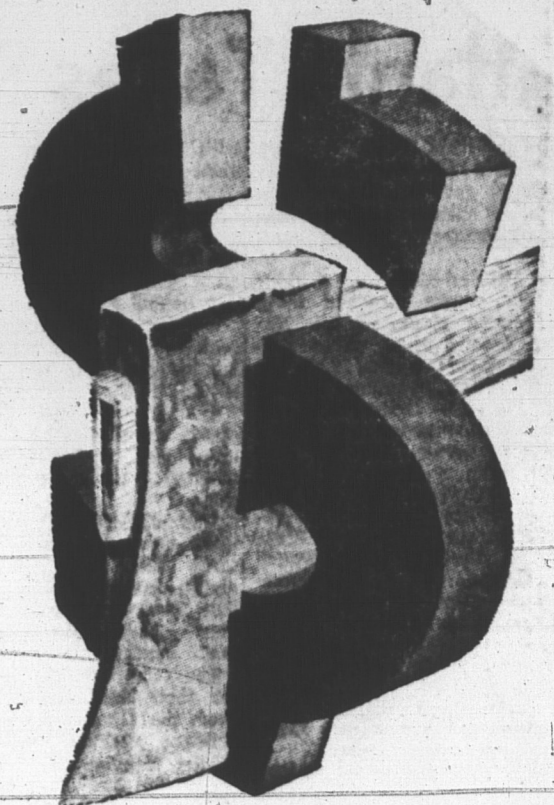
So far, two men and a woman have been arrested. Forged cheques have shown up in Toronto, St. Catharines, Ottawa and Montreal.

Toronto police said the \$100 cheques are always made out to Bob Toa, a fictitious name which, because of its brevity, is easy to duplicate by the cheque signer.

The cheques are said to have been faked as coming from a bank in Hamilton.

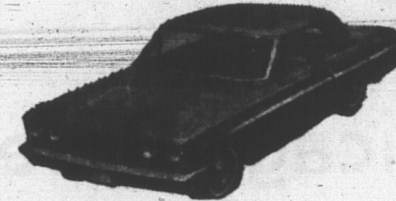

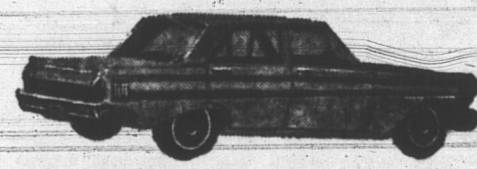

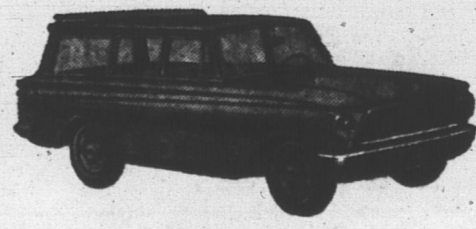

**Increase Noted In Price Index**

OTTAWA (CP) — The consumer price index took another step upward in August to 144.9, an increase of six-tenths of a point from July and 5.5 points from the level of August, 1965.

The Dominion Bureau of Statistics said the record level, representing growth on 1949 prices equalling 100, could be blamed mainly on food costs.

The food index alone climbed 2.1 points during the month to 146.1 with higher prices for most basic items, including all dairy products except processed cheese, such as cereal products as bread and flour, and most meats.

The housewife also paid more for eggs, butter, margarine and many fruits and vegetables—including bananas, apples, strawberries, onions, cabbage and tomato-juice.

The food index last August stood at 137.8.

Although there is no index of wages for an exact comparison, the DBS makes a study of weekly industrial wages based on 1961 averages equalling 100. This index stood at 122.4 in April, latest month available.

**Ballots Go To Postal Workers**

OTTAWA (CP)—Ballots now are in the mail asking some 11,000 members of the Canadian Union of Postal Workers whether they will support a national strike if current pay negotiations with the federal government break down.

The union's national executive announced mailing of the referendum. The decision to seek strike authorization was announced two weeks ago.

The union, which represents the vast majority of inside postal workers engaged mainly in sorting mail, is seeking \$1 an hour increase for all workers under its jurisdiction and an additional 16 cents an hour for those in the mail handler job classification.

Mail handlers now receive \$1.81 to \$2.15 an hour, postal clerks from \$2 to \$2.51 and dispatchers, from \$2.33 to \$2.60.

The union also seeks jurisdiction over some 5,000 additional postal employees who fall into the administrative and administrative support job classifications.

The review of postal pay now under way has an effective date of Oct. 1, 1966. However, some six months usually passes before new pay scales are announced. The postal union has said it will not await such a delay.

It was the 11th consecutive rise for the index, main barometer of living costs in Canada. It is compiled by making a price survey of 300 goods and services most generally purchased by urban families on low-to-average incomes.

Food is one of seven categories that make up the main index.

Among others there were fractional increases for housing, health and personal care, and recreation and reading. The index for tobacco and alcoholic beverages remained unchanged in August while the clothing and transportation indexes were lower.

**Queen Opens Severn Bridge**

AUST. ENGLAND (AP) — The Queen opened the mile-long Severn Bridge near here, ignoring threats from Welsh extremists to blow up the \$22,400,000 span.

Accompanied by her husband, Prince Philip, the Queen rode over the new bridge after officially declaring it open.

Armed guards mingled with crowds at both ends of the bridge after police received telephoned threats from persons who said they would dynamite the span. Strict security operations were taken along the length of the bridge.

The bridge connects England and Wales. For a half crown (37 1/2 cents) the motorist now can shorten by 50 miles the normal west-country route to Wales through Gloucestershire. Top speed on the bridge is 70 miles an hour.
