

Russian Women Cry At Wedding

NEW YORK (AP)—Some Russian women wept at a wedding scene in the American exhibition in Moscow, Mrs. Tobe Davis, fashion consultant and writer, said Tuesday on her return from the exhibit.

"They have only civil weddings here," Mrs. Davis said. "But the spectators were baffled by women's golf clothes."

"The Russians didn't understand our sports clothes and wanted to know what the golf clubs were for," Mrs. Davis reported. "They liked the glamour clothes and some of the women had tears in their eyes when they witnessed the wedding scene."

Mrs. Davis, who had visited Russia three years ago, said the Russians had made tremendous advances in fashion, but it may take five or 10 years for them to catch up with the West.
