The new officers were installed by Rev. Alexander MacKay of Kensington.

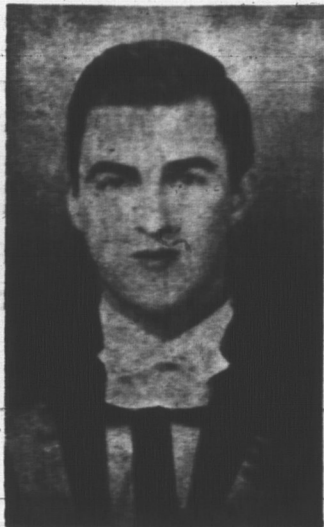
A short devotional period was conducted by the retiring president.

OTTAWA (Special) — Heath Macquarrie, Queens MP, said in the Commons Monday Canadians have been afraid of being enthusiastic about their nationalism.

Mr. Macquarrie, speaking in support of a private member's bill dealing with a youth extension program to stimulate interest in parliament, said Canadians have failed to inspire young people with an appreciation of the eternal verities of the country's political society.

He said it was easy for Canadians to make fun of the obvious nationalism of the Americans but they did inspire their young people in some of the meaningful values of their history.
