

NEW FIRE HALL BEING BUILT AT ALBERTON

Alberton's new fire hall, possibly the first town building ever built during the winter, is pictured above in the first stages of construction.

Income Tax Filing Proceeding Well

Income tax returns are "coming in well," Thomas J. Evans, director of taxation, Charlottetown district office, said yesterday. "This year's early filings have increased considerably over previous years," said Mr. Evans, "but an increase in errors has also been present." Mr. Evans said the majority of mistakes were in connection with incomplete forms and because of the complex system of provincial and federal tax calculations put into effect this year.

Because of the large number of early returns it is impossible to tell people when they can expect their refunds," he said. "The taxpayers' returns are processed on a first-in, first-out basis. There is no point in enquiring about refunds as it is practically impossible to locate a specific return when dealing with millions across the country."

High Charges PC Vote April 8


