Guilty Plea Is Entered To Obstruction

MONTREAL (CP) — Jacques Desormeaux, 30-year-old officer clerk has pleaded guilty to obstructing justice, a charge laid as an aftermath of an abortive gunshop raid last summer when two people were killed.

The charge was that Desormeaux hid a rifle allegedly used to kill one of the two men during the raid on the international firearms company last Aug. 28. The rifle has never been found.

Desormeaux, who has been behind bars since last September, was sentenced to time already spent in jail, plus one day, and was ordered to post a \$500 bond to keep the peace for two years.

Five men were brought to court in connection with the slayings. Two pleaded guilty to non-capital murder and were sentenced to life in prison. The others are awaiting trial.

RAIDERS CLAIM SUCCESS
BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) — An underground Palestinian organization calling itself "the General Command of Storm Troops" has claimed several successful raids into Israel by its forces. A communique said the "storm troops" have attacked Israeli installations, tapping the waters of the Jordan River from the Sea of Galilee to the Negev Desert.
