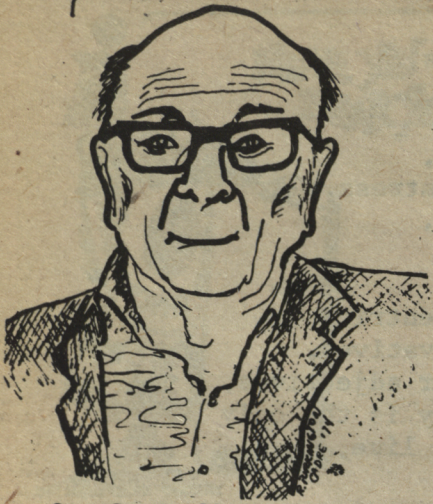


Bradley Scores Hat Trick in U. de M Creaming

With Fall convocation, the official opening of the new library, a bus trip to Fredericton to work on, field hockey,

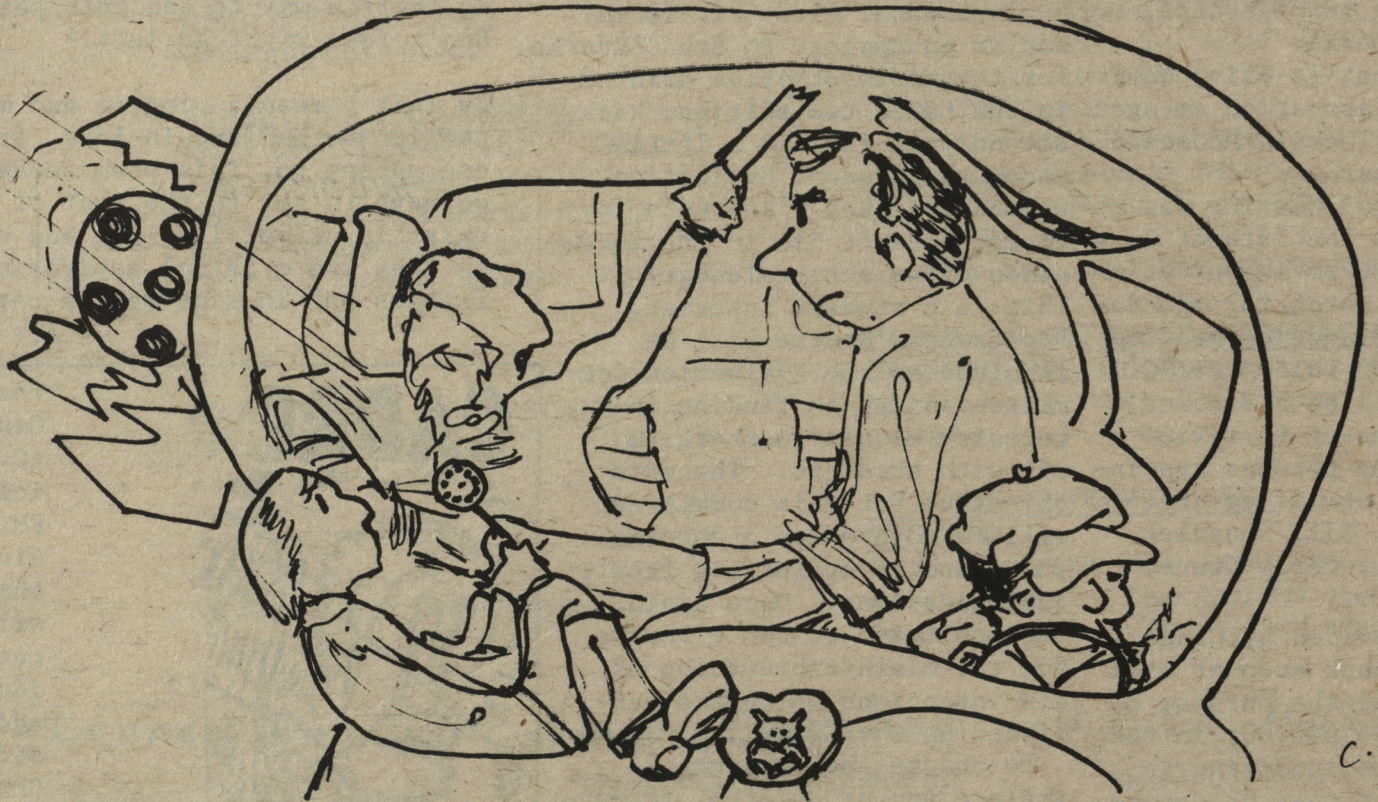

Socky MacDonald got our only 2nd half T.D. Coach Ed Hilton seemed pleased with the overall performance of the team. Certainly the pass defence will get a lot of coaching before the next game... but we won't be facing Cripotis again next year. Colin Anderson, who went all the way as quarterback had difficulty moving the team on the ground but was quite successful through the air as his passes were successful in 16 of the 31 attempts for a little over 150 yards. Except for the passes we held our own defensively.

We look for a victory in Saturday's game at MacAdam Field with Mount. A. and will urge you not to miss a good game.
