

Vikings Found Baffin Island, Not Mainland, Paper Says

MADRID (AP)—The Spanish arrival in the new world and newspaper ABC published Wednesday a chart which it said shows that Vikings discovered in 1003 the Baffin Island in the Arctic Sea, not the Canadian mainland.

"What has this (the island) to do with the American continent?" the newspaper asked.

ABC also published a copy of the Yale University map crediting the discovery of North America to Leif Ericson and other Vikings centuries before Christopher Columbus set sail. The Yale map reopened ancient arguments over who really discovered America—Ericson or Columbus.

ABC said the chart it published was produced in 1485, seven years before Columbus sailed from Spain.

berna Bay and Davis Strait. The newspaper, which devoted three pages to the subject, declared:

"The discovery of Vinland by the Vikings occurred in the year 1003. The map acquired by Yale corresponds to an undetermined date within the 15th century. That is, between the supposed discoveries and the preparation of this marine chart there has passed approximately the same time as passed between Oct. 12, 1492, and our present days."

The Yale map, the university said, proves Vikings explored a mainland area, probably Labrador, years before Columbus came to the new world.

Industry Minister Drury said Thursday

is confident that lower prices announced by Canadian automobile manufacturers will in effect pass on to Canadian buyers this year the \$50,000,000 customs benefit embodied in the U.S.-Canadian automobile agreement.

Mr. Drury said through a spokesman that the price cuts appear to be in the neighborhood of \$70 per vehicle, when spread across the three major manufacturers and the various models of their most popular lines of automobiles.

If Canadian production and sales in the new 1966 model year reach the 700,000 figure attained for 1965 models, the amount will be \$49,000,000, or very close to the \$50,000,000 in what the government regards as "foregone duties." Customs receipts the government would expect to take in, if it were not for the agreement now awaiting presidential signature in Washington.
