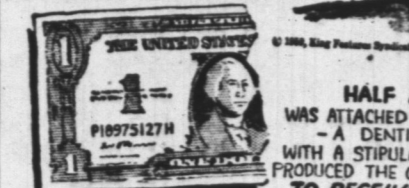

CONTRACT BRIDGE

QUIZ

You are South, both sides vulnerable. The bidding has been: North East South West 1 ♠ Dble 2 ♠

What would you now bid with each of the following five hands?

- 1. ♠KJ33 ♥AQ84 ♦7 ♣Q962
2. ♠Q96 ♥K82 ♦J76 ♣Q973
3. ♠963 ♥K852 ♦10 ♣J9754
4. ♠72 ♥84 ♣Q86542 ♠A93
5. ♠A7 ♥J3 ♣852 ♠AQ9654

1. Redouble. When partner opens the bidding and the next player doubles, the responder's action will usually take one of three forms. He may pass, thus showing a poor to moderate hand with no other convenient bid to make. Or he may mention a suit, provided he does not have more than 9 high-card points (for example, a heart bid would be proper with spade 65, heart KQJ72, diamond 83, club, 9743). Or he may redouble to show 10 or more high-card points. The redouble does not promise support for the opener's suit. Basically, it announces that the doubler is caught between two fires and that a penalty may possibly be exacted from the opponents. Usually, the opener will let the next bid come back to the redoubler for appropriate action. 2. One notrump. The best thing is to identify immediately a moderate hand (about 8 points) and the balanced distribution. If the responder passed instead at this point, he might find it difficult to enter the bidding later and show his scattered values. After the notrump bid is made, the rest is left to partner. 3. Pass. No other bid is better, and silence is in order. Both the clubs and hearts are too weak to name. The chances are that the next player will respond to the takeout double. If, by any chance, the next player passes, thus changing the informatory double, the opener still has a chance to rescue himself if he is afraid of one diamond doubled. 4. Three diamonds. This is purely preemptive and shows a hand that is valuable offensively but weak defensively. The purpose of the preempt is to make it difficult for the opponents to get together in their best suit. There is good reason to think the opponents may have a game in one of the major suits. 5. Redouble. Again the principle already discussed is applied to inform partner that responder has at least 10 high-card points. The showing of honor strength takes precedence over showing the club suit. A two club bid would be acceptable if the ace of spades were a small spade, but since the ace brings the high-card count to 11 points, the redouble becomes mandatory. There will probably be plenty of time later to show the club suit and identify the type of hand held.

Supreme Effort Is Demanded On Disarming To Save World

Italy and Ireland told the United Nations General Assembly Wednesday a "supreme effort" must be made to reach an agreement on disarmament before mankind is destroyed. Both countries placed specific proposals before the assembly as the middle and smaller powers had their say in general debate.

Delayed Acton Rockets Planned

WASHINGTON (AP)—The 375-pound satellite which the United States hopes to place in orbit around the moon early next month will carry two delayed action rockets to help it achieve its goal, it was learned Wednesday. One of them, called a "kick" rocket, will be designed to give the satellite an extra shove in space if the space vehicle fails to get enough velocity from its original blastoff rocket - or gets off course on its way to the moon.

The other, called a "retro" rocket, will be designed to slow the satellite down when it gets near the moon—and thus help put it into an orbit around the moon. Both rockets would be touched off by remote control radio signals from the earth. If they are, it would be the first use of such a combined system in U.S. space history.

Pioneer III, the American space probe now orbiting the sun, was equipped with a retro rocket as a potential aid for going into a moon orbit - but the Pioneer did not come close enough to the moon for such a trial. The Explorer VI Paddlewheel satellite launched Aug. 7, is equipped with a "kick" rocket but the launching was so successful it wasn't needed. Hitherto in the session, disarmament questions have been dominated by the great and nuclear powers, and particularly by Soviet Premier Khrushchev's sweeping demand that the world disarm itself completely within four years. Foreign Minister Giuseppe Pella of Italy stressed control in his formula, saying disarmament should be achieved by successive stages and appropriate international control should be set up at each stage. In ALL FIELDS Disarmament should be pursued simultaneously in the fields of conventional and nuclear weapons and should also go hand-in-hand with security arrangements, he added. Foreign Minister Frank Aiken of Ireland said primary responsibility for reaching preliminary agreements, on which UN decisions might be based, rests with the nuclear powers. But the "ultimate responsibility must rest with the UN." Calling for the creation of a permanent UN police force, he said controlled world disarmament could not be achieved in a "single spectacular bound" but must be approached step by step. Canadian External Affairs Minister Howard Green, scheduled to make his first major UN speech late today, also is expected to touch on disarmament. Canada is a member of the new 10-country disarmament committee established by the UN, due to begin deliberations at Geneva early next year, and also is a leading power in the UN emergency force which has been serving in the Middle East since the Suez fighting of 1956. IRISH PLAN Aiken noted that Ireland has sponsored an Agenda item - yet to be debated - on the "prevention of the wider dissemination of nuclear weapons." "Briefly what we hope for is an agreement between the nuclear powers not to give the weapons to non-nuclear powers, and an agreement between the non-nuclear powers not to make or accept nuclear weapons," he said. Aiken suggested that as a first step toward disarmament member countries co-operate in obtaining the firm application of UN principles in certain restricted areas, particularly where the interests of the two great power groups are entangled and where there is the greatest danger of stumbling into war. Nuclear powers and all other UN members would bind themselves to defend the members of
