

Williams Back In Lineup Tonight Against Pale Hose

NEW YORK (AP) — Ted Williams, 40-year-old, dogged by illness and 70 points behind his best and a year ago, will probably return to the Boston lineup tonight and begin a late season move aimed at winning his sixth American League batting title.

Because none of the contenders have been able to hit consistently, Williams finds himself in a better position to finish on top than when he was bedded with a heavy cold Aug. 25. He has not been to bat since.

When he left the lineup Williams was in seventh place in the batting race, 12 points behind his league-leading teammate Pete Runnels. Monday, Williams, with a .315 mark, was fifth and only eight points behind Runnels.

In last week's games, Runnels collected only eight hits in 33 times at bat and his average dropped five points to .323.

Commission Refuses To Give Saxton License

NORTH ADAMS, Mass. (AP) — Fight promoter Sam Silverman cancelled Monday night's scheduled 10-round bout between Johnny Saxton of New York, former world welterweight boxing champion, and Jackson Brown of Boston.

Silverman said the state boxing commission refused to give Saxton a license pending action by the New York commission on his move for reinstatement. The National Boxing Association suspended Saxton a year ago and later reinstated him but the New York decision, expected after a physical examination last Friday, is not due until today.

At Boston, the state boxing commission, said Saxton's license was suspended for medical reasons Sept. 12, 1956 after he was defeated by Carmen Basilio.

The permit was restored provisionally last month subject to approval by the New York Commission.

Jockey Only Shaken Up In Spectacular Spill

NEW YORK (AP) — Ted Atkinson, 42-year-old Canadian-born jockey from Toronto, was involved in a spectacular spill Monday at Belmont Park, but after examination at the track hospital he was found to be only shaken up. He continued to ride in later races.

Riding Rosy Inning in the second race, Atkinson was moving up on the leaders 1-16 of a mile from the finish in front of the grandstand. Bimbaliet, with Eddie Arcaro up, suddenly quit and swerved in front of Rosy Inning.

Rosy Inning clipped the heels of Bimbaliet, the favorite, and Atkinson did a loop and landed on his head. He rolled over and sat up stunned. Officials said the fact he was wearing a reinforced plastic helmet, made mandatory at most tracks, saved him from possible serious injury.

Cerv moved into second place with a .318 average. Power and Kuenn are deadlocked for third at .317. Kuenn dropped from second place. He had only three hits in 22 tries last week and lost eight points.

In the National League, Stan Musial of St. Louis took advantage of a mild slump by Philadelphia's Richie Ashburn to take over the lead.

Musial, who missed several games because of a leg injury, dropped one point to .340. Ashburn tailed off five points to .336 with a 10-for-37 performance last week.

Wants Good Reason For Forbes Kennedy's Tardiness

DETROIT (AP) — The Detroit Red Wings' beat the other National Hockey League clubs in the training camp punch Monday when more than 60 candidates opened drills at Olympia Stadium.

Before many of the players made a turn around the ice, General Manager Jack Adams was having trouble with one player and threatening to have it with another.

He had salary differences with newly acquired Gus Mortson and wanted a reason for Forbes Kennedy's tardiness.

Mortson, 35-year-old defenseman who hails from New Lis-leard, Ont., came to the Wings from the Chicago Black Hawks.

"I talked to him once," said Adams, "and told him I was going to improve his salary because I didn't think they were giving him enough money over there. Everything was fine. Then yesterday he calls me and says he wants more. I don't know—maybe he wants to retire. Anyway, we're not going any higher."

WHERE'S KENNEDY?
Kennedy's whereabouts were unknown, but Adams warned that the young centre from Charlotte-town, who scored 11 goals for the third-place Red Wings a year ago, had better have a good explanation for being late.

"If he doesn't," said the grizzled general manager, "it'll cost him a hundred bucks. Why is it that everybody else shows up on time and one guy is late?"

After a long domination of the league, the Red Wings slipped to third place last season and lost as many games as they won.

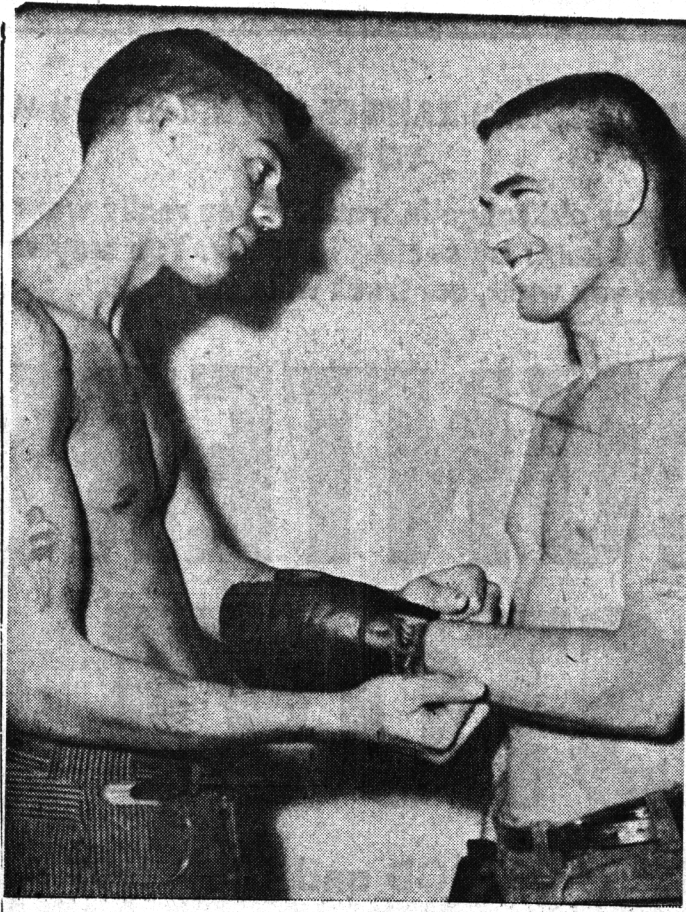
"We shook the team up last year," said Adams, "and there are a lot of vacancies. If some of these other guys don't show me something, there'll be more vacancies."

Captures League Triple Crown For 2nd Time

Nelson also led in all three departments while with Montreal in 1955.
