Dream Comes True For Blind Couple

WINNIPEG, Jan. 6—(CP)—Since their marriage six years ago, 37-year-old Isaac Fehr and his wife Alice, 30, have dreamed of a home of their own. Soon they will have it—but they'll never see it.

Both are blind.

In the early 1920s Mr. Fehr was blinded by explosion of a dynamite cap. Mrs. Fehr has been blind since childhood.

They were married in Winnipeg in 1945 and now have two children—Violet, 5, and Walter, 2. From 1935 to 1946 Mr. Fehr was a basket-maker and broom-maker in the Winnipeg Blind Institute. He quit on orders from his doctor.

Now their dream of a home "where our children will have the room they deserve" has become a reality. They expect to move out of their three-room suite by spring.

The foundation and frame is completed and Mr. Fehr helped in the work. When a reporter visited the scene, he was working 20 feet up, driving nails with unerring accuracy. He uses a braille rule to measure.

Mr. Fehr said he works eight hours a day except Sunday. He said he doesn't think it unusual that he should help build his own home.

"I've been interested in the hammer and saw ever since I lost my sight."

The lot was donated by East Kildonan municipality. A cash fund, started by the Mennonite Brethren Church, brought in about \$2,000.

Quebec Mother, Two Children Die In Fire

QUEBEC, Jan. 5—(CP)—Mrs. Roland Maigny, 24, and two of her young children died in hospital today from burns suffered when fire swept through their lower town St. Malo district home this morning.

Two other of the Maigny children, Guy, 2 and Jeannine, five months, are in critical condition but may survive.

Earlier today Micheline, 4, and her year-old sister Genevieve died. The mother died today.

The fire is believed to have been started by a spark from a wood stove. It broke out about 7 a. m. EST. Neighbors sent in an alarm and tried to smother their way into the house. The woman's husband had left for work.

Firemen found the mother and children in various parts of the house and said they believed Mrs. Maigny was burned in a desperate effort to save the children.

Carloadings

OTTAWA, Jan. 6—(CP)—Carloadings on Canadian railways dropped sharply during the holiday week ended at Dec. 30 to 54,396 cars, compared with 74,375 cars for the previous week, but were above the 49,011 cars for the corresponding week a year ago.

The Bureau of Statistics reported today that increases over the similar period last year were shown in loadings of grain and grain products, coal, coke, ore, building products, pulpwood, lumber, woodpulp and paper and gasoline. Declines were registered in loadings of livestock.
