Montague Chorale's Singing Highly Praised

"I have had a very rich and wonderful night," said the adjudicator, Lloyd Queen following the final class of the evening session of the Kings County Music Festival on Wednesday.

The major number of classes were performed by the Montague Chorale which received high praise from the adjudicator. The high mark of the evening, 87, was awarded to the women's chorus of the chorale for their performance in class 23 "Music When Soft Voices Die." "I have never heard it sung in better taste," said Mr. Queen. The phrases were excellently shaped and the articulation was clear and crisp.

He also commented on the quality of the men's chorus of

the chorale for its performance in class 32, men's chorus unison "Waltzing Matilda" for which they received a mark of 85.

In commenting on the chorale, Mr. Queen said that all selections were done in excellent taste, and that the music chosen where classes had an open selection, was excellent. He also commented on the fact that the chorale used no music and the excellent accompaniment provided by the pianist, Miss Peggy Beck, and of the work of the director, Mrs. Ralph Beck, however, in several numbers he remarked that they could improve on the matter of balance.

The evening began with the Trinity United Church Junior Choir singing "God Gave the Day" in class six for which they received a mark of 83.

The Montague Girl Guides were awarded a mark of 82 for their "Cradle Song" in class 44 and the Montague Brownies received a mark of 84 for their "Weggis Song" in class 44B.

Mr. Queen spoke of his pleasure at having such young choirs performing in the festival and their high quality as well as the excellent work of their directors.

The first number by the Montague Chorale "Canada, Dear Land of Mine" won them a mark of 84.

A trio, class 55, "Gay is the Rose" by Mrs. Arnold Wightman, Mrs. Douglas Coffin and Mrs. George Warner, all members of the chorale, was awarded a mark of 84.

Mrs. Holden MacLure was awarded 79 marks for her harmonica solo, class 226, and for her recorder solo in class 218 (B) she received a mark of 82.

Mrs. A.G.J. Steeves was awarded a mark of 81 for her accordion solo, class 221.

During the evening Mr. Queen spoke of the excellent work being done by Mr. and Mrs. Raoul Raymond, well known musicians, who provided the accompaniment for most numbers in the Kings County Festival and who also teach music in the Montague schools as well as many others.
