Local and Other Items.

KILLED BY LIGHTNING.—Friday afternoon Frank Ricker, aged fifteen years, was struck by lightning at Upper Hainville, York county, N. B. The bolt struck the house near the chimney, went down the stove pipe, blew open the stove and killed young Ricker as he stood in the cellar directly underneath. His father and Melvin H. yt., who were close beside the unfortunate boy at the time, were slightly stunned. The house was badly damaged inside and the exterior slightly.

PREDICTED HIS DEATH.—About a year ago Thomas Hoover, a miller of Evansville, while sick, told a number of friends and relatives about his bedside not to worry about him, as he would pull through all right. "But," said he, "I shall die on May 24th, next year, at 3 o'clock in the afternoon." No one paid any attention to the prediction. Precisely at 3 o'clock on the afternoon of the 24th Hoover, who had been complaining for several days, died suddenly. He was 31 years old.

PLANTING TREES.—A law just passed in Minnesota authorizes park boards in cities to plant trees when petitioned by property owners concerned, and to assess the cost, not exceeding 12 1/2 cents a front foot, on the property improved, this to include the expense of main along the trees for three years and replacing any that may die. The system has been used in Minneapolis for fifteen years, and 15,000 vigorous, well protected trees along the streets prove its success—the only for which has been remarkably small.

THE CAT CAME BACK.—A suburbanite had a curious experience recently; he sat down to dinner and removed the cover from the plate, prior to carving the meat, and placed it on the floor. Suddenly he saw the cover begin to move, and had he been a drinking man he would have thought he was "seeing things;" he continued to carve, but could not arrest his attention from the cover which gradually continued to move towards the door. A cold sweat came on him and he decided to make a plunge and endeavor to unravel the mystery, and as he lifted the cover he found he had placed it over the cat, which had been struggling to make its escape.—Halifax Recorder.

A Big Farmer. WINNIPEG, Man., May 27.—The Tribune says: "Sir William C. Van Horne, president of the C. P. R., intends to make East Selkirk his place of residence for a certain portion of the year, where he will establish a large farm. He has called for tenders for the construction of a substantial two-story residence building, 40 by 90 feet and stables, cow sheds and barns, covering a space of 300 by 30 feet. Several local contractors have figured on the work. It is believed that his son, Mr. R. B. Van Horne, will manage the farming operations."

Bank Damages BOSTON, May 29.—W. O. Wiley, a Charlestown coal dealer, has obtained a verdict of \$25,000 against the Banker Hill National Bank. He said that he was injured that much in his business because the bank honored checks of his at a time when he had an amount on deposit sufficient to meet them. The bank's contention was that at the time the checks were drawn he owed that institution more than his amount on deposit.
