

**Gov't Silent
On Salary For
Lead Of Fair**

OTTAWA (CP)—Attempts to find out how much the federal government is paying the commissioner-general for the lead of the Fair were unsuccessful in the Commons Tuesday.

Georges Valade (PC—Montreal) (St. Marie) posed the question first to Works Minister Deschênes but Mr. Deschênes said Commissioner-General Pierre Dupuy still is on the staff of the External Affairs Department.

Mr. Valade then turned the question to Prime Minister Pearson, asking also whether a successor soon would be named.

Mr. Dupuy who was Canadian ambassador to France when appointed commissioner-general earlier this year.

Mr. Pearson said Mr. Dupuy had a great many weeks paid retirement leave coming to him when he took on the top managerial post for the 1967 exposition in Montreal. It seemed unnecessary to pay him a salary as commissioner-general until the retirement leave expired.

He gave no indication of when an ambassador to Paris would be named.

**41 Million Acres
Are Leased In
Arctic Oil Hunt**

OTTAWA (CP)—Oil companies and individuals have retained permits covering 41,000,000 acres of the Arctic islands in the second and more expensive phase of the oil and gas exploration period. Northern Affairs Minister Laing said Tuesday in a Commons statement.

The amount permit holders now must agree to spend on exploration in the next three years has increased to 15 cents an acre from the five-cent level fixed for the first three years of the permit's life.

About 16,000,000 acres have been dropped. Mr. Laing said the large acreage retained despite the increased cost is a good sign for the future of the Arctic-island area, where experts have said a major world petroleum pool may be discovered.

Aside from the retention of 11,000,000 acres in the islands, officials said outside the Commons there have been applications made for exploration permits on another 2,500,000 acres.

Bulk of the Arctic island permits were granted together after a record burst of activity three years ago.

No oil has been discovered yet although one dry hole was put down on Melville Island last winter ago. Wildcat drilling is proceeding on Cornwallis and Saururus islands, with no major difficulties reported.

**N.Y. Mirror
Ceasing
Publication**

NEW YORK (AP)—The New York Mirror, a morning tabloid and the second newspaper in daily circulation in the United States, announced Tuesday night that it is ceasing publication.

The publisher of The Mirror, Hearst Corporation, announced that Tuesday night's editions, dated today will be the last.

The Mirror's name, good will and physical assets have been purchased by the New York Daily News, the rival tabloid in New York morning newspaper field.

The Mirror, with a daily circulation of about 282,000 was second only to The Daily News, with a national high of nearly 600,000 daily circulation.

The Mirror was founded some years ago, as a competitor to the Daily News in the new and thriving tabloid field.

Reports of its demise have been recurrent in recent years and were heightened during last winter's 11-day New York newspaper "blackout." However, in January, Mirror publisher Charles B. McCabe snarled a runner with the announcement that The Mirror "will be around for a long time."

CANCELS VISIT

OTTAWA (CP)—Prime Minister Pearson said Tuesday Sir Alexander Bustamante, Prime Minister of Jamaica, has cancelled his mid-October visit to Canada because of ill health. He said he hopes Sir Alexander's health will permit a visit in 1964.

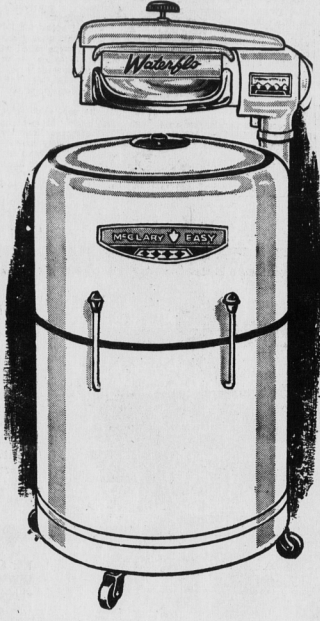
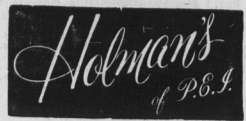
