Snowfall Totals 7.8 Inches Here

By 8 o'clock last night the meteorologist at the Charlottetown radio range reported that since Dec. 12 approximately 17.8 inches of snow have been dumped in this part of the province. Of that about one inch fell in the 24-hour period before that time.

During the six-day period, Sunday, Dec. 16 records show that five inches fell, and the next highest snowfall was Dec. 12 when 4.3 inches was measured.

At 8 p.m. Charlottetown was getting some light snowfall activity, and this was forecast to continue throughout the most of the night with occasional light rain mixed with the snow.

Late evening temperatures were reported at 30 degrees with the mercury rising, and it was expected to touch some where between 33 and 35 degrees. Shortly before dawn today temperatures were expected to drop five or more degrees, with the high today forecast to be 25 degrees.

At the same time last evening the barometer was reported to be reading 29.71 inches and was falling steadily.

At that time the 'met' observer, said that the weather in Saint John and Yarmouth indicated that rain would hit the island sometime during the night. He reported that both those centres reported rain, and temperatures around 35 to 37 degrees.
