Death Of Miss Annie MacDonald

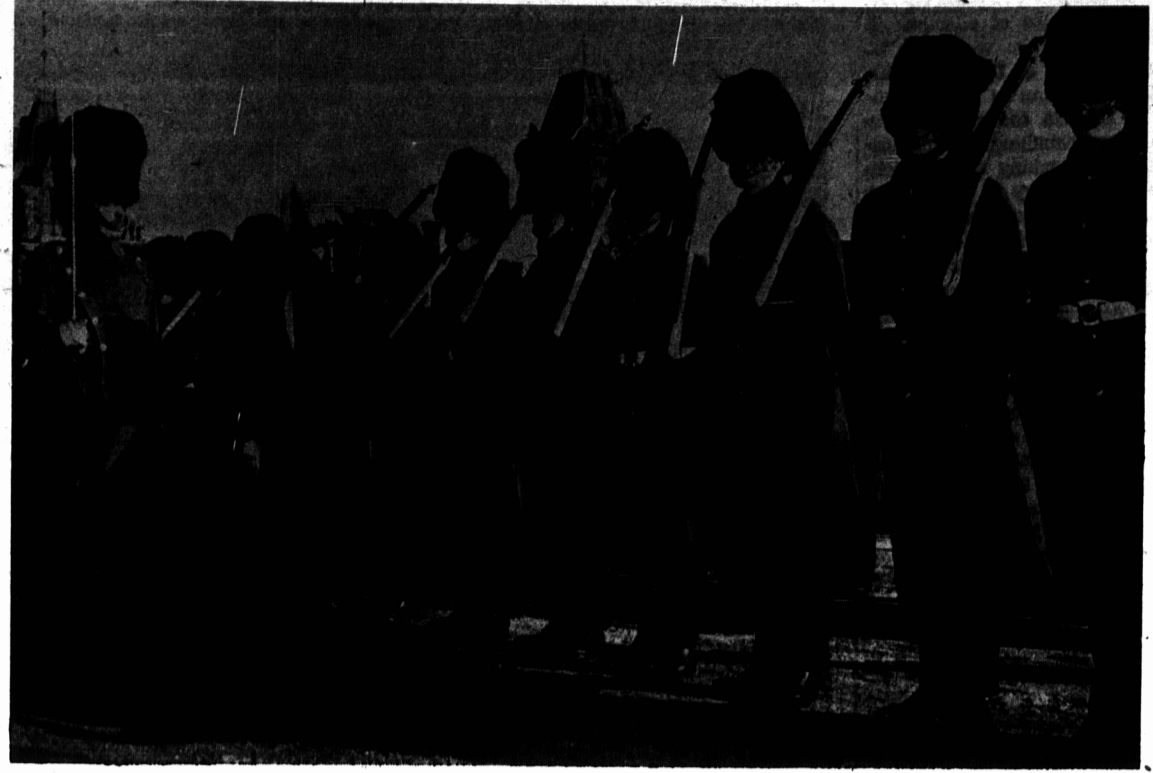
