Brisk Spring Boom In Jobs Trims Unemployment Figures

OTTAWA (CP) — The usual brisk job boom of late spring trimmed Canada's unemployment rate to 3.7 per cent in May, lowest percentage for that month since 1957 when it stood at 3.5.

A report by the labor department and the bureau of statistics estimated the mid-May unemployment rate at 265,000 out of a national labor force that totalled 7,123,000.

In April the unemployment rate was 3.3 per cent with 371,000 jobless. Last year's May figure was 4.2 per cent or 283,000 out of work.

Between April and May the labor force grew by 155,000 but this was offset by 261,000 new jobs—most of the job gain coming in occupations such as farming and construction that normally spur in this period. There were 92,000 more jobs on farms and 169,000 in non-farm industries.

In comparison with a year earlier, the May labor force was bigger by 209,000 and the number of jobs up 237,000. However, farm employment was down 19,000 on the year while non-farm jobs increased by 256,000.

Regional unemployment rates dropped significantly between April and May, but the Atlantic region continued to be well above the national average. It had 7.3 per cent of its labor force hunting for work, compared to 12.8 per cent in April.

MORE JOBLESS IN EAST
The Atlantic area also was the only one in which the May unemployment rate was higher than a year earlier, when it stood at 6.8 per cent.

Rates for other regions, with the April and May, 1964, rates in brackets:

Quebec 5.2 (6.7), 5.9, Ontario 2.3 (3.1), 2.8, Prairies 2.4 (4.3), 2.6, British Columbia 3.9 (4.7), 5.9.

McGill University Turns Away 500

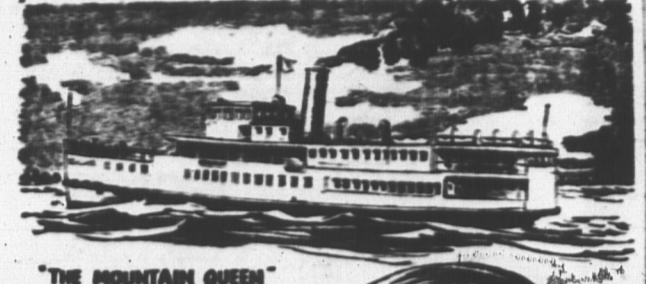
