Morning Stock Letter

NEW YORK, April 23—Except for the Tax Bill now being studied there is no domestic news which may have an unusual effect on the market this morning. Oils Elevator first quarter reported 16 cents a share on the common stock as against only part of the preferred dividend earned the first quarter of last year. Dividend meetings are American Home Products, Brooklyn Union Gas, Preoprot, Texas, and Lehigh Coal and Navigation Co.

Yesterday's market won some friends for it but we are of the opinion that subject to a rally of a few dollars higher in the industrial average the market will run into at least some secondary selling.

MORNING STOCK LETTER The low volumes and restricted gains of the present rally are not impressive and offer no assurance that the selling movement is over. However, the lack of rallying power may very well be due to the uncertainties of the French election which will be held Sunday. While

the French political situation and its bearing on the European crisis will not be altogether clear until the final election on May 3rd it is believed that a pronounced swing one way or another of French public opinion would show itself definitely in the first vote and help to clarify the general European outlook. The nervousness of the French franc as the election date approaches is not helping stock market sentiment. We continue to feel, nevertheless, that while political uncertainties are many and while trade activity may soon begin to level off that the general economic and technical conditions are too good to permit an extended market decline at present.

President Sloan's prediction of a 2,000,000 car year for General Motors this year speaks well for the outlook for the motor industry generally as well as business as a whole. Among the stocks which have not received the attention which the outlook seems to warrant are the mail order issues, which should be among the principal beneficiaries of heavy government disbursement expected to be made this summer.

TORONTO, April 23—The mining market was heavy all round today, chiefly on New York weakness but the recent display of buying lethargy was no doubt a factor. Spotty strength appeared in the early session, inspired mainly by recent annual statements indicating progress but they were caught in the afternoon decline and they lost as much as the others. The exchange index for the gold's slipped back a point and the miscellaneous mines index was off two points from 134.23 to 132.17. Conlagas, Conlarum and Argosy perked up in the early trade, helped by the Conlagas annual statement. The parent company stood up under the afternoon sell-off, holding a gain of 25 cents but cent. gain and Conlarum, after reaching 2.75 dropped to 2.58 for a net loss of 7 cents. Announcement of a 5 cent dividend for Ventures, half to be paid in June and the other half next January, impressed traders unfavorably and the price quickly dropped 15 cents to \$1.90. The close at 1.95 was off 10 cents net. Siscoe lost 11 cents, Pickle Crow 10 and Beattie 8. Issues losing 2 to 5 cents included San Antonio, Red Lake, Red-Adair, Airways, Sylvanite, Teck Hugher and McKenzie. Macassa lost 6.

Mt'l. Market Follows Wall Street Trend

MONTREAL, April 23—A flood of bearish sentiment that followed reactionary tendencies on Wall Street depressed prices as much as four points on Montreal Stock Exchange today.

Scattered issues worked against the downward trend, but most of the list lined up with weak leaders and closed lower. Banks, usually steady, showed the widest losses. Nickel, more or less steady at the start, lost ground when the bids came lower and finished off 1 1/2 point to 47. Noranda gave up 1/2 but Hollinger firmed a small amount.

Constructions did little to add to the day's volume but some of the big losses were shown in that group. Foundation Company and Steel of Canada dipped a point each. Canada Cement and Dominion Bridge eased fractionally.

Royal Bank of Canada took the biggest jolt with a four-point drop at 168 while Commerce slipped a point to 150. Others were slightly easier on odd-lot transfers.

More than 2,000 shares of the day's trade was taken up by Brazilian Traction, but the loss was only 1/4 at 11%. Canadian Hydro-Electric Preferred firmed 1/4 while Montreal Power, Canada Northern, British Columbia and Power Corporation yielded a bit.

Stocks Plunge Downward On New York Mart

NEW YORK, April 23.—With losses ranging from 1 to as much as 8 points, stocks today suffered their worst break since July 26, 1934.

All classes of securities participated in the plunge, but rails, steels and industrial specialties were in the lead.

One of the leading causes, it was suggested, was further unsettlement in the foreign situation, with the French financial picture somewhat cloudier in view of the elections, which start Sunday and which, possibly, may lead to a devaluation of the franc or a gold embargo.

The Associated Press average of 60 issues showed a net drop of 1.8 point at 60.4. Transfers totalled 2,171,030 shares.

Chrysler's first quarter earnings of \$2.65 a share against \$2.12 in the similar 1935 period, announced after the close, were in line with previous forecasts. Profits were the highest for any similar quarter in the company's history. Declaration of a \$1.50 dividend was a pleasing surprise as many brokerage experts had expected a \$1 payment, the same as three months ago, would be voted.

Shares of Chrysler pushed up through the 100-mark in the first hour of trading, but fell back with the rest of the list later to end at 98, off 1 1/2 points. General Motors lost 2 at 65 1/2. The latter stock was the most active of the day.

Among outstanding casualties were Union Pacific, off 8 points at 118.

Others, conspicuously soft, included Santa Fe, off 4 at 73; Westinghouse, off 3 1/2 at 113 1/2; U. S. Steel, off 2 1/2 at 65 1/2; Case, off 6 1/2 at 157 1/2; Johns-Manville, off 4 1/2 at 80 1/2; N. Y. Central, off 2 1/2 at 35 1/2.
