WEST JORDAN, Utah, Aug. 10 (AP) - Confident young Rex Layne said today he is the coming world's heavyweight champion and that he would like to lift the title from Jersey Joe Walcott in September.

"I think Rex rates a shot at the title ahead of Rocky Marciano," chimed in Marv Jensen, Layne's youthful appearing manager. "He's beaten both Ezzard Charles and Walcott."

Jensen said Jim Norris, president of the international Boxing Club, phoned him Saturday and offered Layne a shot at the winner of the Marciano-Walcott fight.

Norris was quoted as saying Layne's 10-round decision over Charles Friday night at Ogden made him a top attraction. Jensen said Norris wanted to match Layne with the Marciano-Walcott winner in Miami next February.

Many ringsiders disagreed with the decision Jack Dempsey, referee and sole judge, awarded Layne over Charles. But the 24-year-old Lewiston, Utah, sugar beet digger, definitely was the aggressor. He bullied, butted and charged Charles in almost every round.

TRURO, N.S., Aug. 10 (CP) - Three horses established their record and another lowered his at the Truro Raceway harness racing event Saturday.

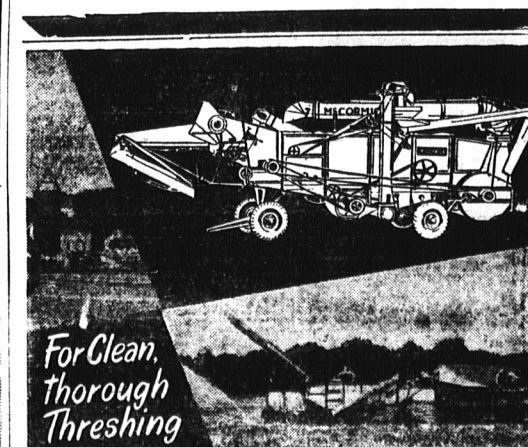
