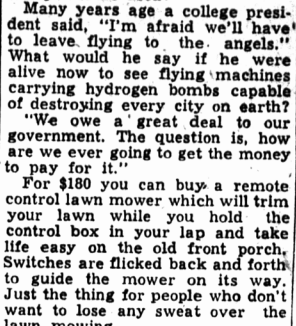
"We owe a great deal to our government. The question is, how are we ever going to get the money to pay for it?"
