

### Holstein Sets Milk Record

A Prince Edward Island Holstein cow, Seaside Susie Abberwick, has the highest lifetime production record for twice-a-day milking in Canada. It is indicated in the current issue of the Holstein-Friesian Journal, with a production of 250,454 pounds of milk. Her lifetime butterfat production was 8,889.

The cow which was owned by Walter Butain and son Roland—the present owner is Roland Butain—qualified for a Gold Ribbon which requires only 200,000 pounds milk and 8,000 lb. so she exceeded both requirements by big margins in her 15 lactations.

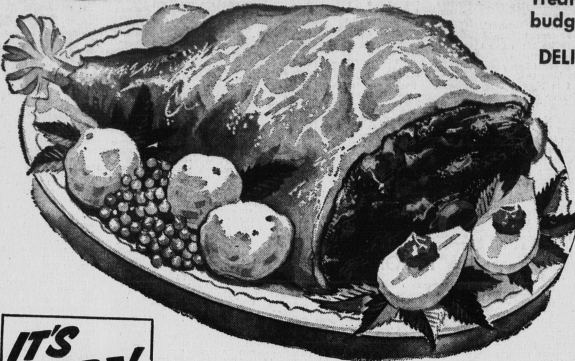
