KING'S COUNTY EXHIBITION.

We are glad to learn that it is the intention of the King's County Exhibition Association to arrange for an agricultural meeting to be held at the Exhibition grounds, Georgetown, on Wednesday afternoon, October 2nd, when addresses on subjects appertaining to the improvement of agricultural, horticultural and industrial productions will be delivered by some of the most prominent gentlemen of the Maritime Provinces.

MANITOBA SCHOOLS.

The second message of the Dominion Government has been published. By it the Government of Manitoba is assured that Canada does not want to impose inefficient schools upon the minority in Manitoba, and that there is no desire whatever on the part of the Dominion Government to control the Manitoba schools from Ottawa.

PROSPECTS OF THE MARKET.

The complement of a good crop is a low price. This rule is likely to prevail this year. We regret that the prospects of the market are not very bright. Hay was a short crop, and it seems likely that those who have plenty of hay to sell will be fortunate.

Thus Canada emerges from the discussion with untarnished reputation, and although it is no satisfaction to Canadians to know that the charge of fraud now lies at the door of the United States' producers, it is pleasing, as the Mail and Empire remarks, to reflect that the result of the incident has been that the attention of the British public has been called to the fact that Canada manufactures a better and purer article of cheese than any other country.

GLEANINGS.

The celebrated statistician Mr. M. G. Mulhall, whom lately published papers on the power and wealth of the United States, which attracted much attention, has made a similar study of the Colonial Empire of Great Britain.

Canada shows no such rate of progress as Australia—her growth in population being, in twenty years, but 31 per cent., against the Australian 112 per cent., and the growth of her commerce being 12 per cent., against 48 per cent.

South Africa is the newest of British colonies, and shows the most rapid development. In twenty years its population and its commerce have both grown 124 per cent.

The Yankees find that they may with advantage study and adopt Canadian measures. They have adopted our system of voting by ballot, but as they assume to act upon the principle that no good thing comes out of Canada, the call for "the Australian system" lately they have been directing their attention to our banking system, and a very instructive pamphlet on our bank rate currency by L. Carroll Root has been issued by the Reform Club of New York.
