CONCERNING SNOW-PLUGHING and **RURAL MAIL BOXES**
 Now that our snow ploughs are again engaged in the struggle to keep roads open to traffic, the matter of mail boxes comes to the fore. While it is a fact that these boxes have no legal right to be installed on a highway, it is recognized that they do serve a useful purpose and are indeed part of our rural way of life. But what happens when snow banks form on our road sides right where the boxes are usually placed? Obviously it is not possible to move the snow at high speed and raise the boxes. If we go slow we can avoid the boxes, but as we only raise the snow banks when we plough slowly, we are adding to our troubles instead of curing them. If we are going to have open roads, they must be ploughed efficiently and that means as fast as the ploughs can safely operate. I believe the answer lies in removing the offending mail boxes and replacing them with cheap temporary ones. If this is done, you will not only avoid damage to your regular mail box, but you will also have better winter roads. Your co-operation in this matter will be greatly appreciated.
