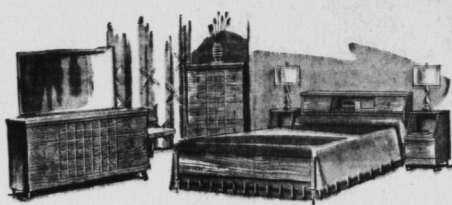

SOURIS HAS 2 MORE FIRES

SOURIS - Two more fires in Souris over the weekend have been attributed to the suspected frebrog believed active in the area. These fires bring to 11 the number of outbreaks fought by the Souris fire department in the last 10 days, although only 13 have been of a suspicious nature.

The barn of John Cheverie was heavily damaged Saturday night and the barn of Thomas Carter was damaged last night. Both fires are believed to have been started from the inside. The doors in both buildings had been carefully closed. It was noted.

Along with the damage to the Carter barn, 35 bales of hay and a quantity of straw were burned. Two horses, a calf and 12 pigs were removed from the barn by Mr. Carter.

Emotional Selling Is Blamed For New Stock Losses At N.Y.

NEW YORK (AP) - Emotional selling once more drove New York stock market prices down to steep losses last week. As in the break of two weeks ago, the weekly fall was the worst in more than 30 years.

That brings the market decline back to a comparison with the bad old days of 1932 - the pit of the depression - or beyond. Weekly records of stock averages were not kept beyond then on a comparable basis.

The Dow Jones industrial average plummeted \$3.82 points to 611.78. It was at a high of 724.91 last Dec. 13. Two weeks ago the Dow took a loss of \$0.57.
