Geologist Says Quebec Must Plan Own Mines

MONTREAL (CP)—A Montreal geology professor says the time for glib talk about Quebec's great mineral resources is past and it is "high time Quebecers lifted themselves out of their lethargy" and did something about those resources. Roger Blais, professor of geology at L'Ecole Polytechnique in Montreal, outlined his views in a paper presented at the annual congress this week of the French-Canadian Association For the Advancement of Science.

Having reviewed the discovered resources of Quebec—an area almost one-fifth of that of the United States, excluding Alaska—Prof. Blais said: "It is high time the people of Quebec lifted themselves out of their lethargy, interested themselves in the facts of mining and tried to understand the importance which the science of geology ought to play in the economy of the province."

Mixed Results In 3 Provinces

TORONTO (CP) — Only three provinces—New Brunswick, Ontario and British Columbia — had mixed voting patterns Monday. The other seven had landslide of one kind or another. The Liberals blanked the Opposition 7-0 in Newfoundland. But the Conservatives won 4-0 in Prince Edward Island, 11-1 in Nova Scotia, and 17-0 in Saskatchewan. Fifty-five of Quebec's 75

seats went Liberal, leaving 20 to be split among the Conservatives. Creditistes and Independents. The Conservatives won 19 of Manitoba's 14 seats and 15 of Alberta's 17. Only Ontario, New Brunswick and B.C. distributed their votes to any marked degree. The Liberals won 51 of Ontario's 85 seats, the Conservatives 25 and the NDP nine. New Brunswick went 6-4 for the Liberals. In B.C., the NDP won nine, the Liberals seven and the Conservatives and Social Credit three each.

There will be an interruption of electric power on Sunday, November 14, weather permitting between the hours 10:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m.

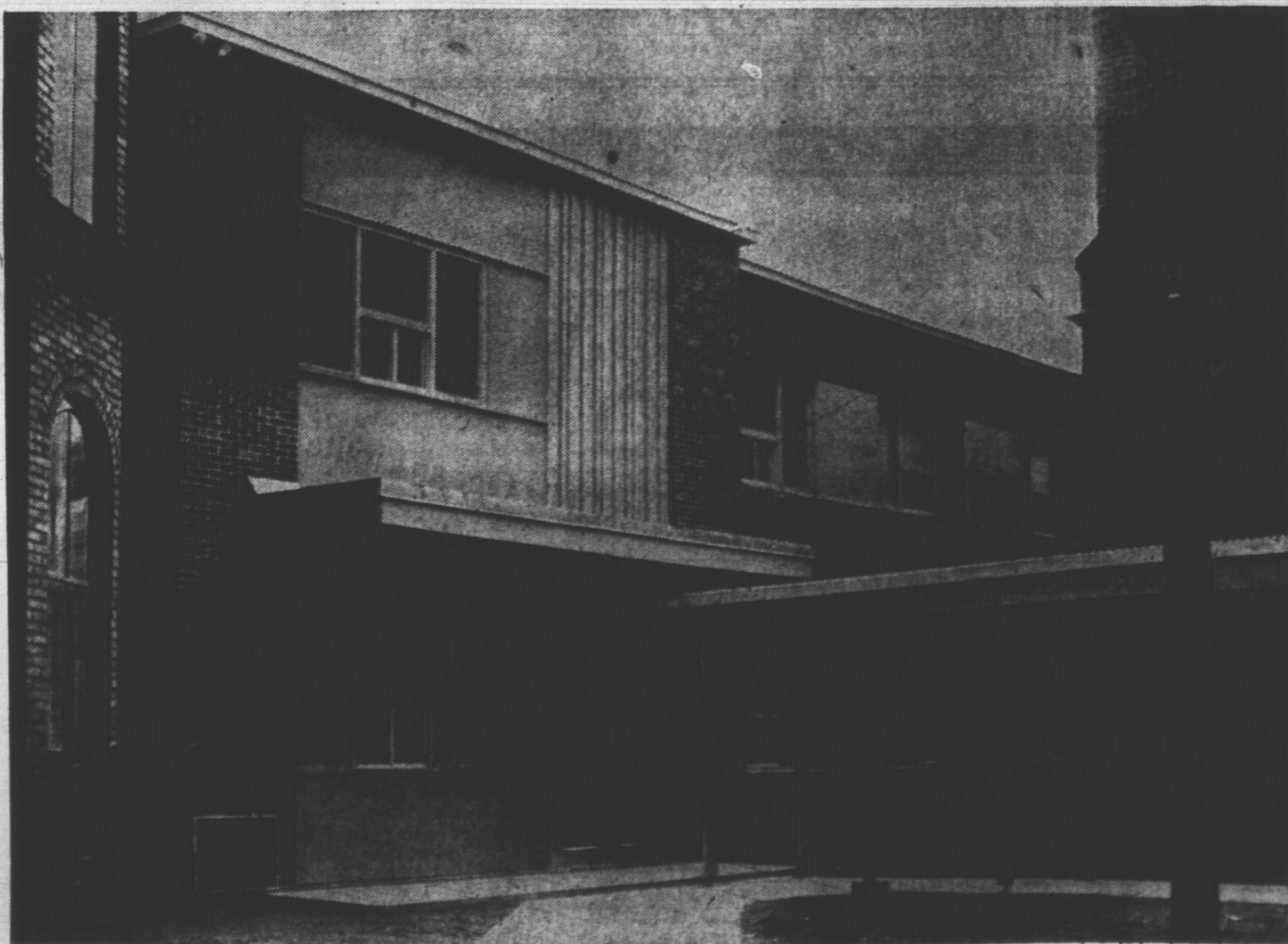
This interruption is necessary to commission our Georgetown Substation and make transmission alterations at our plant substation.
