Monalisa Painting Arrives in New York

NEW YORK (AP) - The woman with the world's most famous smile - the Mona Lisa - arrived here yesterday in a royal welcome amid security precautions befitting the queen of the art world.

The Leonardo da Vinci masterpiece came here on a brief stopover from Rome, where it will be exhibited at the National Gallery of Art in Washington.

The Mona Lisa also will be shown at the Metropolitan Museum of Art here before being returned to the Louvre in Paris.

After crossing the distance passenger was given a two-room first class cabin that normally would cost more than \$2,000. She shared it at intervals with four members of the French security police, who accompanied her here as a guard.

Economy Shows Strength In Spire Of Dollar Crisis

TORONTO (CP) - The Canadian economy this year, despite the dollar crisis, has exhibited considerable strength and 1962 should prove to be the most prosperous year since 1956, says Wood Gundy and Company.

The company, in a review of business prospects, says the current upswing in the economy now will become less vigorous in the last three years to three persons who informed the government about tax evasions by others - \$100 to a person in the Montreal taxation district; \$1,000 to a person in the Toronto district and \$25 to another in the Newfoundland district. The information was filed in the Commons Wednesday by Revenue Minister Hugh E. John Fleming at the request of J. J. Benson (L-Kingston).

The federal cabinet has committed 49 of its 61 death sentences imposed in Canada since the present government took office in 1957, the justice department reported in a reply filed in John R. Matheson (L-Leeds).

Fishermen in the Bay of Verde area on Newfoundland's St. John's Peninsula are protesting the federal fisheries department to ban the use of trawlers in their waters. The protest was advised in information tabled for James R. Tucker (L-Truro) Wednesday. The petition was received at the department's office in St. John's.

Canada will be forwarded to Ottawa, where it "will be considered."

Canada cast a vote against a UN resolution condemning Portuguese action in Angola because of the extreme nature of the tactics. External Affairs Minister Green said in reply to David Lewis (NDP - York South) who asked why Canada voted against the resolution since Mr. Green had previously said that it opposes Portuguese action in its African dependency.

An \$85-million highway program in Newfoundland's Terra Nova national park will employ 35 to 40 persons, the Northern Affairs department reported in a written reply to J. W. Pickersley (L - Bonaville).

Canada Obtains Documents At Auction Sale In London

LONDON (CP) - Important Canadian historical documents were purchased on behalf of the Canadian government at an auction here Wednesday.

Book dealer Frank Maggs successfully bid £75 for copies of letters by Sir John A. Macdonald and £50 for a copy of a journal of James Murray, former governor of Quebec.

The Wolfe letters are unpublished and are not known to survive except in the copies mentioned at Sotheby's. Seven of the eight letters deal with the "Wolfe went very cheaply," Maggs told a reporter after the auction. "I was quite surprised - and happy that I could get them for the price paid for them."

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FINANCE MINISTER

Finance Minister Nowlan said French-speaking members of the cabinet have set on the board chairman as well as the director last August.

The government intends to bar from the Great Lakes the coasting trade all vessels which were transferred to Commonwealth registries since plans were announced to reserve this trade to Canadian and Commonwealth vessels.

Transport Minister Balcer said he said the government made the decision to bar the vessels and sees no reason why it should include ships deliberately registered in Commonwealth wealth registry since the announcement.

The Commons gave a first reading to a bill which would restrict the prohibition to broadcasting stations reaching the area where an election is being held.
