Ottawa Minister Opens Mission At Civic Stadium In S'side

Dr. R.W. Armstrong of Ottawa opened the Mission to the Nations last evening in the Civic Auditorium in Summerside, and used as a theme "The fundamental principles of life". This theme will be continued throughout the mission this week.

He emphasized sacrifice as one of the fundamental principles, not for self preservation but for the sake of others. He cited instances to show that this has been the motive for the greatest acts of sacrifice known to man. We live in a world where these principles must be recaptured, especially in

the realm of spiritual affairs, and that men and women consecrate their lives to Christ who is supreme example of one who gave his life for the whole world. The gospel of Christ as lived in dedicated lives in the power that can help save the world in our time, he said.

Approximately 500 persons were present from Summerside, Kensington, Crapaud, Tryon, North Bedeque, Bedeque, and O'Leary, despite very inclement weather. The mass choir, under direction of Dr. Peter MacDonald of Crapaud, was composed of members from all of the districts represented.

Mrs. Eric Sheen was the accompanist on the electric organ. The Trinity United Church quartette also provided a number, and there was congregation singing during the mission.

The program was under the direction of Rev. Cecil Webber of Trinity United Church in Summerside; the lesson was read by Rev. Coper-Smith of Bedeque; and the prayer was given by Rev. Lloyd Archer of Tryon.

Death In Ottawa Of Mrs. Mary MacLean

Mrs. Mary Gertrude MacLean, of 194 Carling avenue, widow of Dr. John D. MacLean, former premier of British Columbia in 1927-28, died suddenly at her home Wednesday.

Born in Tara, Ont., Mrs. MacLean was educated there and at business college in Toronto. She married Dr. MacLean, who was once also a chairman of the Canadian Farm Loan Board, in Tara in 1911. They came to Ottawa in 1929.

Mrs. MacLean was a member of St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church and of the board of the Elizabeth Residence.

Surviving are three sons, Roderick MacLean of Ottawa, Dr. John MacLean of Toronto, and Dr. Bruce MacLean of Owen Sound; three daughters, Misses Jessie and Jean MacLean, both of Ottawa, and Mrs. A. Reid Tilley Betty of Westmount, Que.; a sister, Mrs. L.B. Thomson of Owen Sound, and 12 grandchildren.

Funeral services were held in the Hulse and Playfair chapel, Rev. Ian Burnett, DD, officiating. Burial was in Beechwood cemetery.
