Local and Other Items.

PICKING MAYFLOWERS.—Mr James Stoddard, of Mount Denson, picked a fine bush of Mayflowers (trailing arbutus) at the Falmouth railway grade, one day last week.

SIGNS OF PROSPERITY.—The Shediac Boot and Shoe Company are doubling capacity for business. They recently placed in their factory a pegging machine which pegs a thousand pairs of shoes per day, and cuts off the peg on the inside of the shoe.

TRACED TO MILK.—A report of the Health Committee of Vancouver B. C., declares that 20 cases of typhoid fever in Vancouver were traced to bad milk supplied by one Weaske. He kept his cowyard in a filthy condition.

GOLD OUTPUT.—Up to the end of September, this year, the gold output of Ontario amounted to \$188,231, while for the whole of last year the output only reached 190,241. The gold output will be at least \$70,000 more this year than in 1897.

LOST HIS MONEY.—A Halifax policeman put \$30 in bills in the same pocket with a handkerchief when leaving home a few days ago, and while walking on Barrington street he pulled the handkerchief out, forgetting the \$30. When he arrived at the city hall he found the money was gone.

LIQUORS AND TOBACCO.—It is estimated that within the past six months the value of the cargoes of liquors and tobaccos confiscated in this province will amount to something like \$20,000, and from this fact may be gained some idea of the extent of the underground traffic in its entirety—Halifax Recorder.

KLONDIKE NUGGETS.—Dr LeBlanc brought home with him from Dawson city several nuggets of Klondike gold. One is nearly as broad as a man's hand but not so thick; it weighs about 9 ounces and is worth about \$150. The others are much smaller. They are just as they were taken from pay dirt, except that they have been worn bright by carrying—Moncton Times.

A PLEASANT EXPERIENCE.—A doctor of Jersey City claims to have found a tapeworm in an egg which was served for his breakfast. The egg had been cracked in boiling and, when he took it from the dish he saw what seemed to be a worm, protruding from the crack. This worm was found to be coiled up, and when stretched out proved to be four feet long. The white and yolk of the egg were in a perfect condition, the worm occupying the large end of the egg, in which the air is stored.

IT WAS LOADED.—There was a little blow out in Albert church a few days ago, quite a surprise to everyone. It seems that a small contract had been let to blow up stumps in the churchyard, and as a place of security the contractor had used the church stove as a magazine. The weather getting cool, the church stove was lit to keep the building warm for service, and there chanced to be inside a little of the giant powder which had been forgotten. All of a sudden there was an explosion, and now the church needs a new stove—Victoria Colonist.

GUNPOWDER BY GASLIGHT.—In Quebec city recently a clerk in the employ of W Doyle, hardware merchant, was weighing five pounds of powder under a gaslight, when an explosion occurred which shook the neighboring stores, smashed the windows and doors of Mr Doyle's store and caused quite a sensation. Fortier, the clerk who was weighing the powder, was badly burnt about the face and hands and had to be sent home. It is impossible to say what caused the explosion, as it is stated that nobody but the cashier and Fortier were in the store at the time.

FRENCH FAITH IN RUSSIA

Why Brisson was Voted Down

LONDON, November 7.—To what extent the French depend on Russia is amazing and from what is learned to-day it is believed that the overthrow of the Brisson cabinet the other day was not so much on account of the Dreyfus matter as in consequence of a sort of semi-official utterance published by the Russian government in the 'Novoe Vremya' of St. Petersburg to the effect that the French cabinet contained no politicians with one exception who really sympathized with friendship between France and Russia and therefore Russia could not support them. This was an intimation that as long as the Brisson Administration was in office the Franco-Russian alliance would be considered by the Czar as non-operative and that no help could be expected from Russia as long as M. Brisson remained at the head of affairs. The French legislature took the warning to heart and decided upon the sacrifice of M. Brisson one of the many sacrifices which have already been made by that country for the sake of the alliance with Russia.
