OTTAWA (CP) — Dominion statistician Herbert Marshall has been elected president of the International Statistical Institute at a meeting in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, it was reported Thursday. 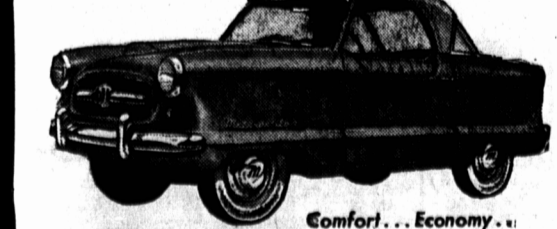
