

AGENT EXPOSED

HALIFAX (CUP) - Solicitor General Jean Pierre Goyer's Security Services Department was hard at work in Halifax recently when one of its agents was found out.

Dave MacKinnon, a well known figure in Halifax left-wing circles, was recently exposed as a conscious paid S.S. agent. He was a member of the New Morning collective, one of the organizations Goyer said his department would investigate.

He was supposed to be operating as a double agent giving only general information about the left to the S.S. and collecting information about the Security Force for future use by the left. But because of his par-tice, New Morning came to the conclusion that MacKinnon was either a conscious police agent or is so "screwed up" that he must be treated as an agent.

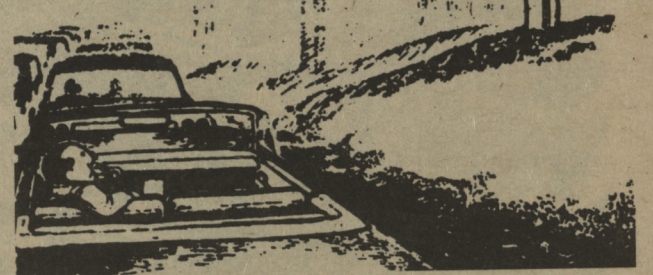
MacKinnon started working for the Security and Intelligence Branch of the R. C.M.P. in June, 1971. At that time., the central staff of New Morning in Halifax, the leadership of the Partisan Party in Vancouver, and Red Morning in Toronto knew of his activity.

One example they cited is The Eastern Front which MacKinnon apparently instigated. The small group recently threw a molotov cocktail into the store-room of the information Canada bookstore in Halifax. New Morning denounced the act and the group as adventuristic.

MacKinnon was accused of being adventuristic and a provocateur. The latter accusation fits in well with a police agent's actions. He was also exposed because his stories of his activities and the information he had did not click with other information New Morning received. During his five months as a double agent, MacKinnon reportedly earned about \$5,000 for the information he supplied.

When the S.S. was formally set up in August, his salary jumped considerably. As a result of his actions, a New Morning Press Release urged that "the left in Canada did not deal with MacKinnon as he cannot be trusted".

EUROPE

Youth fares will be introduced on Scandinavian Airlines routes between Denmark, Norway, and Sweden on a space available basis beginning January 1, 1972, subject to government approval.

Young people between the age of 12 and 21 and bona fide students from 22 to 26 years old will be eligible for 50% discounts as stand-by passengers on these SAS services.

SAS' Intra-Scandinavian routes serve Copenhagen, Aalborg and Aarhus in Denmark; Oslo, Bergen, Stavanger and Kristiansand in Norway; and Stockholm, Norrköping, Jönköping, Gothenburg, and Malmö in Sweden.

While they can be used by Canadian and other foreign visitors, the Intra-Scandinavian youth tickets will be sold only in the three countries concerned, at airports and at the offices of SAS and IATA appointed travel agents.

Eligibility for the discounts will be determined by the passport birthdate and, in the case of students 22 to 26, by a certificate signed by an authorized official providing proof of registration at a school, college or university offering full time educational, vocational or technical courses for the school year.
