SPECIAL DESPATCHES TO THE EXAMINER. Newfoundland Affairs. The Modus Vivendi Bill Delayed. LONDON, March 24. In the House of Commons to-day it was announced that Lord Knutsford had eabled Sir John O'Brien, Governor of Newfoundland, saying that the bill giving effect to the modus vivendi would not be proceeded with until April 16th, giving time for further communication on the subject between the Imperial and Colonial Governments. The proposal of the Newfoundland delegates of settling the whole question by territorial concessions, or equivalent, has been submitted to the French Government. GREAT POLITICAL BID. To Divide the I. C. R. St. JOHN, March 24. The disclosure regarding the proposal made by the Grit leaders to divide the Intercolonial Railway, granting one portion to the C. P. R. and the other portion to the Grand Trunk in consideration of supporting them in the election, has created a great sensation, and is fully corroborated here. The scheme is denounced as the greatest political bribe ever offered by any political party in Canada. A NEW SCHEME In the Interests of Settlers. OTTAWA, March 24. Bridges and Eden, of the Manitoba and Northwestern Railway, are here perfecting a scheme for repatriating Canadian settlers in the Western States. He Makes a Partial Confession. NEW YORK, March 24. The Brooklyn police last afternoon arrested Hugh Miller, aged 22, on a charge of setting fire to six tenement houses within six weeks. Miller denied that he was the party, but afterwards made a partial confession. In his last fire he used kerosene oil and stuffed the keyhole of the fire alarm box with paper. The Washington National Bank CLOSES ITS DOORS. NEW YORK, March 24. The Washington National Bank closed its doors late yesterday afternoon, owing to the serious impairment of its capital. It appears that the bank's resources have been loaned out by the President to two friends or confederates. The two accounts amounted to \$121,000. President Sherman has disappeared.
