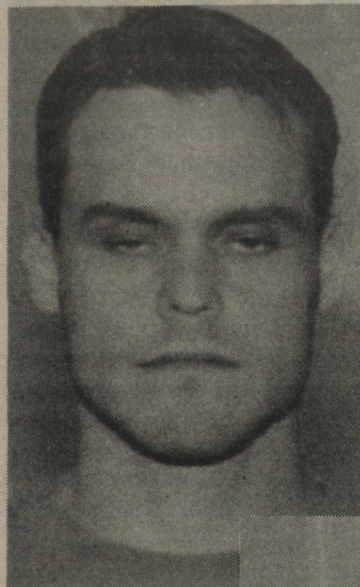

I think maybe if Campus Security would worry less about its own prestige and allow the R.C.M.P to step in, things would be done more efficiently.

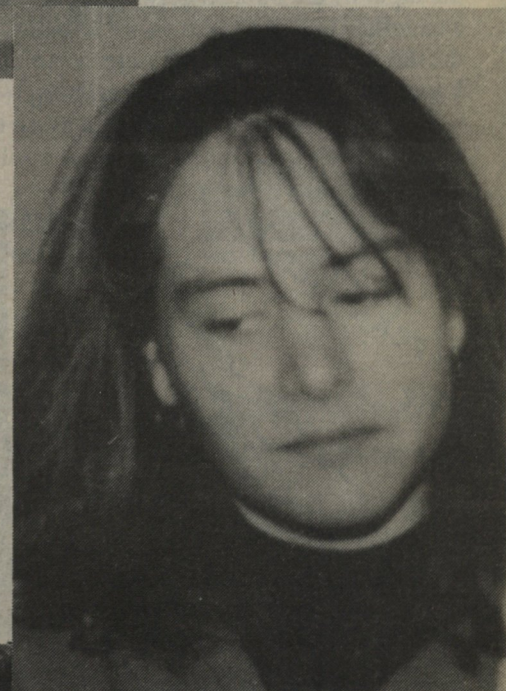

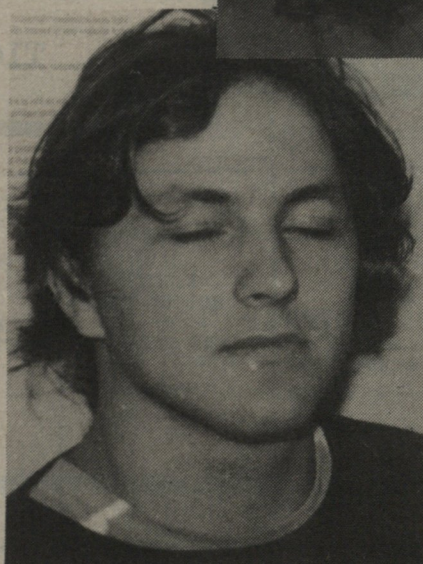
