



'e Added As Interest In Royalty Grow

LONDON (Special)—Indicative of the steadily growing round of duties imposed on members of the Royal Family, and of the world-wide interest which is shown in the activities of all of them, is the appointment of a new press secretary at Clarence House, the home of Queen Elizabeth, the Queen Mother, and Princess Margaret.

Up to the present, all press inquiries concerning the Queen Mother and Princess Margaret have been handled by the Queen's Press secretary at Buckingham Palace, Commander Richard Colville and his staff. But the burden of these inquiries, added to those regarding the Queen and the Duke of Edinburgh, has become so great that this new post of press secretary of Clarence House has been created.

Announcement of this new appointment will be made from Buckingham Palace in the near future. The man who is now being groomed for it is Major Arthur John Stewart Griffin of the 2nd Dragoon Guards. For the last five years, he has been an eque-

ry on the Queen Mother's staff, and has become very popular with the Queen Mother and Princess Margaret. He was on the staff which accompanied Princess Margaret on her tour of the Caribbean last year.

Music Game Won By Queen Mother

LONDON—Queen Elizabeth, the Queen Mother, has a musical quiz program of her own, every day she is in residence at Clarence House. Opposed to her in this game is Pipe Major Kessie de Laspee, who has been on loan from the Lond Scottish Regiment to Clarence House for the last seven years.

Three mornings a week, standing below the Queen Mother's window, the pipe-major skirls his way through a "secret" selection of bagpipe tunes. The Queen Mother, having her breakfast to this musical accompaniment, does her best to identify the tunes which he is playing. And with her Scottish upbringing and background at Glamis Castle, where there were always pipers on the Castle staff, she does a good job of identification. After the performance, notes are exchanged, congratulations extended between the Queen Mother and the Pipe-Major, depending on who has "won the game" on the particular day. The Queen Mother, says the Pipe-Major, is invariably the winner.

"GAME" ENJOYED
Pipe-Major Laspee admits that the Queen Mother is very knowledgeable of pipe music. "She knows more about pipe music than anyone I have ever come across who was not a piper. It is very rarely that I can 'stump' her with a tune. She comes out and reels off the name of every tune I've played. And she is almost always right—and obviously enjoys guessing what the tunes are."

In July, the Queen Mother will show her appreciation of Pipe-Major Laspee's seven years of service as her piper by presenting him with a monogram brooch. But, according to him, he will not be able to keep it in his family. When he dies, it will have to be passed on to the next pipe-major to officiate at Clarence House.

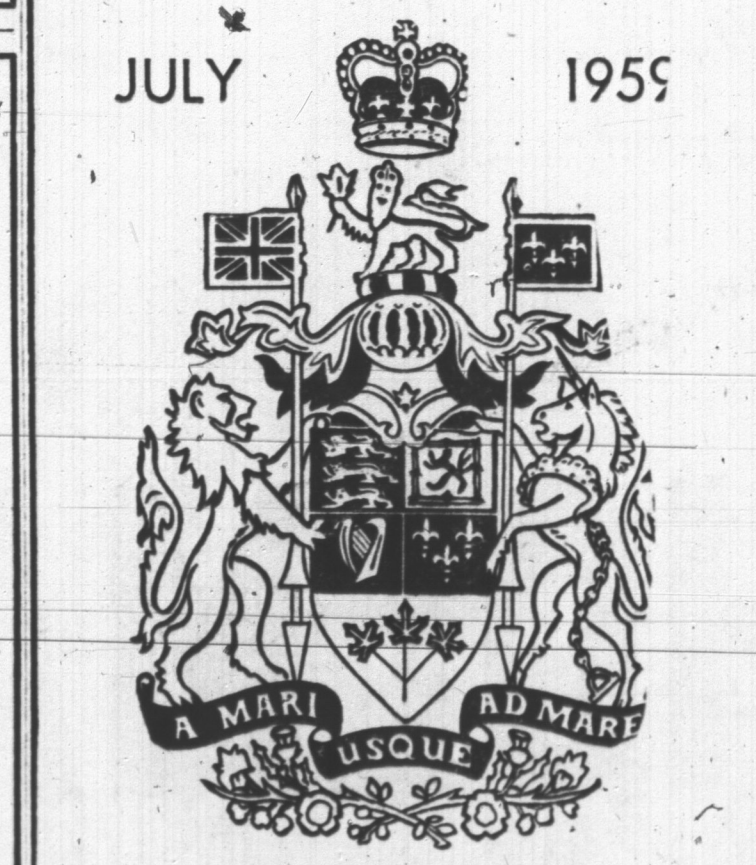
