Have a good week, and we'll see you on Wed. nite - RIGHT?

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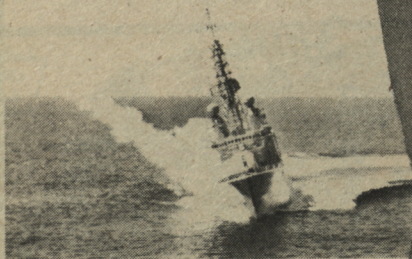
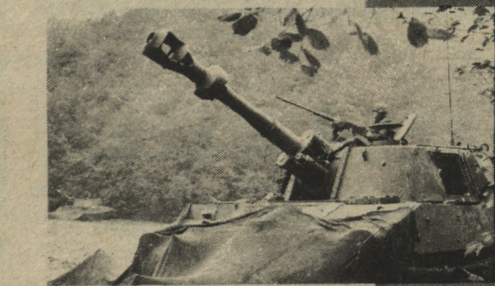
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
