Newfoundland—South East Coast.
LIGHTS AT CAPE RACE AND CAPE PINE.

INFORMATION has been received at the Admiralty, that it has been decided to make the following changes in the lights at Cape Race and Cape Pine, on the south-east coast of Newfoundland, viz:—

The fixed light at Cape Race to be altered to a *revolving* white light, attaining its greatest brilliancy every *half minute*.

The revolving light at Cape Pine to be altered to a *fixed* white light.

It is expected that these changes may take place some time in August 1865, but the precise date, with further information, will be published in a subsequent Notice.
