Sgt. McLennan Wins Top Honors At P.E.I. Rifle Association Meet Here

Sgt. G. G. McLennan, Alexandria, won both the Grand Aggregate and the Ottawa Aggregate at the conclusion of the third day of the Provincial Rifle shoot over the ranges at Squaw Point yesterday. It was the second successive year that the steady shooting Alexandrian walked off with top honors in the annual provincial meet.

In the feature match yesterday, Sgt. G. A. Coles, Prince Edward Island Regiment (17th Recce), Summerside, won the Jones Memorial Match in a shoot off with Cpl. W. M. Beatty, of the Summerside detachment, R.C.M.P. Both scored a 100 out of a possible 105 in the regular shoot at the 200, 500 and 600 ranges. The shoot off was decided on the slight shot. Placing third was Miss Mary McLennan who scored a 99.

A Nova Scotian, Gnr. C. G. Strong, 47th Anti-Tank Regiment, Windsor, triumphed in the MacKinnon Match which saw the highest 27 in the Grand Aggregate compete in 10 shots at the 500 yd. range. Gnr. Strong scored a perfect 50, followed by Capt. E. R. Burke, and Capt. R. A. McCabe, both of 17th Recce, Charlottetown, with 49's.

It was the best day of the shoot thus far for Island riflemen and a decided contrast to the downpour of the previous day. Conditions, however, were a bit tricky at the 600 range. Riflemen were keenly pleased yesterday to see Major J. M. (Bisley) Jones visit the range. He holds the remarkable record of having made the Canadian Bisley team nine times, and actually represented Canada on five occasions. His first trip to Bisley was in 1902. The Jones Memorial Match is in memory of his son P. O. Arthur M. Jones who was killed while on a bombing mission over Germany.

This morning the United Services Officers Club Match will be fired. It is on the same basis as the Arthur Currie Memorial Match which is fired at Ottawa. It calls for 10 rounds at the 600 yd. range without sling. A run down to the 100 yd. range, firing two rounds at each the 500, 400, 300, 200 and 100 yd ranges. Ten rounds snap-shooting another 10 rounds rapid fire at the 500.

Tonight a banquet will be held at the Keppoch Beach Hotel when prizes will be presented.
