

MEDICAL BILLS

As you are probably aware all students registering at UPEI pay a fee for medical insurance. This year we have switched to the University Health & Accident Plus Life Plan. In coverage this is very similar to the previous insurance; in some cases it is extended. The main differences are: (1) it is cheaper (2) the student PAYS for drugs and the student fills out a form, obtainable at the Student Union Office, which the STUDENT sends to the insurance company and the student is re-imbursed by the insurance company with the cost, less \$1.00. The student administers all claims with the insurance company thus giving a privacy to personal matters that was not possible heretofore. We have had a lot of inquiries about the plan, so will show below a brief description:

<u>Dental Expense</u>	Dental & Oral Surgical Procedures max. \$50.00 per tooth	not covered
<u>Eye Refractions</u>	Optometric Services 1 in 2 years	not covered

Also covered Private duty Nurse, Semi-private/private, Chiropractor, Osteopath, Physiotherapist, Chiropodist, Podiatrist, X-Rays, Ambulance Services, Wheelchair Rental/crutches, Braces and other Medical Appliances

Additional Benefits Outside Canada

<u>Hospital</u>	Max. \$2,500.00	up to \$75.00/day x 90 days = \$6,750.00
<u>Medical</u>	up to \$2,500 \$25.00 deductible	

To answer the most common inquiries: The dates of the plan are from 1 Sept. 80 to 31 August 81. The Pill is NOT covered. Dental coverage is for accidents to natural teeth from an external force. Eye refractions ARE covered but limited to once every two years. Those who have other coverage may receive a rebate PROVIDED application is made before 30 Sept. 80, but we may call your attention to the wide coverage and advantages offered to travelling students that are not offered in many other insurances. We might also advise that, for married students, DEPENDANT coverage is available for only \$15.00. If you have any inquiries, please contact the Student Union Office. We'd like to hear from you.

CHEMISTRY CLUB

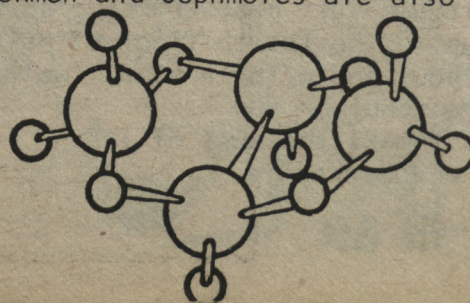
