

Search For
Sub Thresher

PORTSMOUTH, N.H. (AP)—The U.S. Navy narrowed the area of its search for the sunken nuclear attack submarine Thresher with the recovery of 15 small boxes of metal rings from the ocean floor.

The navy said the parts were recovered Monday by a research ship working "drag lines" in the area of prime interest.

The recovered parts were described as common to many ships.

The navy said they were found near the last known position of Thresher when she sank with the loss of 129 lives April 30 about 220 miles off Boston.

The metal parts, known as "o-rings," were brought to the surface by the Lamont Laboratory ship Conrad, which continued to work in the search area with the oceanographic research ship Gilliss.

Also being studied by the navy is the latest set of pictures taken at the ocean bottom last weekend with cameras lowered from the research ship Atlantis II.

The navy said the pictures showed metal, paper, wiring and other metallic objects and added that they "furnish what is believed to be the best clue in the Thresher disappearance."

History adds
to island charm

History and romance, added to the natural beauty of the province, provide an atmosphere both inviting and inspiring to the island's many visitors. If there is any doubt of this, one has only to glance at the number of tourists registering at such places as the Confederation chamber, Green Gables, Woodleigh and the Montague museum.

The Confederation chamber some 16,000 signed the visitors book last year. This is estimated by rental commissioner Robert Craig, as only a third of the number actually passing through.

A trip to Charlottetown is hardly complete unless one visits the room and views the surroundings where early statesmen sowed the first seeds of confederation. Here are to be found the original table and chairs used, in 1864, by the delegates. Here, too, are documents and photographs depicting a pre-confederation era. It is an inspiring and impressive arrangement, ably explained by the commissioner in charge.

Many tourists who come to the island come not as strangers but as old friends. This is so because of the creator of "Anne of Green Gables" and of the delightful series of "Anne" stories which have popularized Prince Edward Island as a scene and characters throughout the world. Lucy Maud Montgomery, in private life, Mrs. Ewan MacDonald, was the author of "Anne of Green Gables", one of the world's best-selling and best-loved novels. Born at Clifton, P.E.I. Island, Nov. 30, 1874, she passed away on April 24, 1942.

The home of her grandparents in the National Park, at Cavendish, the original Green Gables in which she spent most of her childhood, is a landmark for tourists and devotees of the simple style and fresh imagination of the girl who lived and wrote there. Over 38,000 people are reported to have visited the "home" last year.

It is interesting to note that the National park had over 200,000 visitors with the number of campers placed in the vicinity of 28,000.

Many parts of the Island are likened to the English countryside and many people from abroad are quick to mention this fact. This natural theme is given impetus when a visitor to the province calls at Woodleigh, the estate of Lieut.-Col. E.W. Johnstone at Burlington.

Recreations of famous castles and churches, cottages and inns have been faithfully done to scale by Col. Johnstone whose one time hobby, has become practically a life's work.

It is reported that 40,000 people, including children, visited Woodleigh last season. Over 8,000 adult tickets were sold. There is no charge for children. This Spring, the Mill and the Pines will be added to the replica and a start has already been made on a new castle, "Dunvegan". This replica will be 40 feet long and will require 100 tons of granite, and will be large enough to enter. "Dunvegan" is situated on the Isle of Skye, and is the oldest inhabited castle in Scotland, the home of Duke Flora MacLeod.

Such that is rich and vivid in the history of the island brought to life for visitors through the Garden of the Gulf museum. It is one of Montague's outstanding attractions.

Established some five years ago as an expression of the way in which the Island preserves its links with the past, the museum is enjoying a steady increase in public interest, both at home and abroad.
