\$45,000 Budget Is Approved By Montague RHS Trustees

MONTAGUE — A proposed budget of \$45,000 was approved by the trustees of the Montague Regional High School at the annual meeting held Tuesday night in the school auditorium.

Only 26 of the 177 trustees from the 39 districts were in attendance. The small attendance was remarked upon by several speakers and the chairman of the board stated he hoped to see more at next year's meet-

ing and advised that the meeting had been well advertised but that he knew most farm people were busy at this time of the year.

He also pointed out that the board had budgeted an amount of \$10,000 for the erection of a garage on the grounds for the care and maintenance of the buses, part of which would be taken care of by the government grants. It was the opinion of the board that this would cost the cost of operation of buses considerably.

He also advised that three new 48-passenger buses were to be purchased to take care of the additional pupils in the next year.

The secretary, Mrs. Ruth MacLeod advised that the cost to the district of the new 14-room school would be \$61,000 and that the government grants would amount to \$11,000 making a total cost of \$72,144 for this addition to the regional school.

During the business part of the meeting the four retiring members of the regional board were recognized. They are: Laughlin Gillis, Eldon; Russell Compton, Belle River; Howard MacLeod, Dundas; Lawrence Doucette, Montague.

H. J. Hynes, superintendent of schools in his annual report stated that the residents of Montague and surrounding districts are to be commended for undertaking to provide in 10 classrooms for pupils of the area. The number of districts participating in the regional setup is quite gratifying and

Boat Is Lost At Naufrage

ST. PETERS—A 30-foot fishing boat was lost at Naufrage east of here about noon yesterday but the owner, Thomas Gallant of St. Margaret's, was rescued.

The boat was reported to have gone out of control in heavy surf at the narrow entrance and crashed into the breakwater.

Joseph Steele of Goose River was on the wharf and threw a rope to Gallant, who was alone.

The boat sunk but later the engine was salvaged. The boat was said a total loss.

Gallant had some lobster aboard, but not a large quantity. It was reported.

A strong northerly wind was blowing, and kicking up a heavy on-shore surf.

The fact that others are giving serious consideration to joining is very encouraging, he stated.

C.A. Shaw extended a vote of thanks on behalf of the ratepayers to the chairman of the regional board, Paul Kingsbury; the secretary, Mrs. Ruth MacLeod; and the 11 board members.
