Local and Other Items.

MONEY IN LOBSTERS.—A lobster packer of Isle Madame is reported to have paid one of his fishermen who resides in Atrichat over \$500 already this season for his catch of lobsters. Unfortunately this is an exception, not the rule.—Hawkesbury Journal.

A CANADIAN'S CLAIM.—Gustav Bertrand, a Canadian, who is at present in Binghampton, N. Y., claims to be the discoverer of the North Pole. He describes the country as being an island surrounded by ice. A small tribe of large built people, not Esquimaux, lived there. The manner of living is similar to that of the Esquimaux, and he experienced many hardships. There are two seasons, he says, mild and cold. In the milder weather lichens grow there.

FOUR OF A KIND.—Mrs. James Platt, of Union Mills, Ind., gave birth to a quartette of girls. The mother is sixteen years old, while the father is upwards of thirty. Three of the quartette died soon after birth. The fourth bids fair to live. The attending physicians say the case is without precedent in medical history. Births have been recorded of quartettes with a division of males and females, but no case has been recorded, they say, where the babies have been of one sex.

DAMAGE FOR A HUSBAND.—The action for damages brought by Madam Resal, of Paris, France, as a result of the loss of her husband by the sinking of the French Line steamer La Bourgogne, in collision with the British ship Cromartyshire, July 4, 1898, off Sable Island, Nova Scotia, has resulted in a verdict against the company of 100,000 francs. The plaintiff at the same time was debarred from claiming any money lost with Mr. Resal, which may hereafter be recovered. The court found the company responsible for the acts of the captain, who was declared to be at fault in not bringing the ship to a standstill after collision, in losing time in launching the boats, and in not furnishing the passengers with lifeboats.
