

Consolidated Edison Outlines Power Views

NEW YORK (CP)—The position of Consolidated Edison, the big New York City utilities company, on the purchase of hydroelectric power from Churchill Falls, Labrador, has not changed since spring, a spokesman said here.

Con Edison shareholders were told by President John V. Cleary May 16 that purchase of Labrador power from New York City would not be feasible until Con Edison is given permission to proceed with its proposed pumped-storage power project at Cornwall, N.Y. That issue has not yet been resolved; Con Edison goes before the Federal Power Commission Nov. 14 in new hearings.

The spokesman said that, in addition, serious negotiations for Labrador power would be likely only if Con Edison were assured the power would be competitive in price with other base-load capacity. Base load is the power used around the clock.

The proposed Cornwall hydroelectric plant would use power from another source to pump water from the Hudson River into reservoirs. The water would be released through the plant to provide power at peak load hours or during emergencies, and be returned to the Hudson River.

At the Con Edison shareholders meeting here in May, Cleary said: "We are still investigating the feasibility of an extra-high-voltage line for transmission of power in the range of 1,000,000 to 1,500,000 kilowatts from the proposed hydroelectric plant at Churchill Falls in Labrador. However, this remains a relatively long-range project, aiming toward the availability of a new source of firm capacity, starting sometime in the 1970s."

"But it would not be feasible to proceed with the project until we are assured that our Cornwall plant will be constructed."

NEEDED BY 1970

Brinco sources have reported that Con Edison was interested in buying 20 per cent of Churchill's 10,000,000-horsepower capacity, if available by 1970 or soon after. Brinco is unlikely to have power for sale until five years from now, but on the other hand the Cornwall, N.Y., project of Con Ed also has been delayed.

Canadian sources have said Hydro-Quebec would be able to resell Churchill Falls power to Con Edison for 4.5 kilowatt mills, making it possible for the utility to deliver it to New York City for about six mills. This was estimated to be about half a mill less than the anticipated price of nuclear power here.

The Consolidated Edison spokesman emphasized Monday that the local utility's interest in Canadian power is conditional upon the price being competitive.

NEEDS STEADY SOURCE

Con Edison's interest in Labrador power has been based on the possibility it will need a steady source of power for the pumping job at Cornwall, 40 miles north of New York City.

Ethics Being Questioned In Aid To Draft Dodgers

VANCOUVER (CP)—The president of the University of British Columbia has questioned the ethics of professors here working to help American draft dodgers.

Dr. John B. Macdonald, commenting on an announcement Monday night that eight professors at his university and Simon Fraser University have formed a committee to aid young Americans opposed to the draft and the Viet Nam war, said:

"I personally question the ethics of Canadian citizens making positive overtures to American citizens to help or encourage them to emigrate to Canada for the purpose of avoiding a legally determined responsibility as American citizens."

Mr. Macdonald said the question of who should be admitted as immigrants to Canada is a matter for the federal department of manpower and immigration.

Douglas Sanders, a Vancouver lawyer, announced the formation of the committee to aid American war objectors. He said the committee plans to distribute information on emigration to Canada to Americans of draft age opposed to the Viet Nam war.

Mr. Sanders claimed the committee, active for the last three weeks, has attracted more than a dozen potential draftees to Canada. A pamphlet on Canada's immigration laws prepared by committee members

has been reprinted at the University of California, he said.
